"The Trials of Alger Hiss" (1980).

7:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday at the Detroit Film Theatre, 5200 Woodward, phone 832-2730, \$1.50. Running time 168 minutes.

One-time presidential aide Alger Hiss was convicted of perjury in connection with charges of espionage in the 1950 case prosecuted by Richard Nixon and Whitaker Chambers. While the question of Hiss' guilt or innocence may remain forever in doubt, there is little doubt that Nixon and Chambers railroaded Hiss in one of the raucous trials ever conducted. In all probability, the prosecution manufactured false evidence against Hiss, as this John Lowenthal film sets out to document. The focus is also on politician Nixon's motives during the trial, perhaps a cue taken from the book of another presidential aide, John Dean. Dean wrote in "Blind Ambition" of how Nixon — during Watergate's darkest hours — looked back with a frightening fondness on how he handled the Hiss case.

The Redford kicks off a new series of films running through Nov. 29. As always, organ recitals precede the pictures, beginning at 7:30. It's a good-looking season of films offering patrons some popular classics on the big, big screen. Highlights include "The Adventures of Robin Hood" (Sept. 19, 20) with Errol Flynn, and Charlton Heston in "Ben-Hur" (Oct. 17, 18). "On the Town," directed by and starring Gene Kelly, is one of those smashing '40s musicals. Lots of dancing, music by Leonard Bernstein and also starring Frank Sinatra, Vera-Ellen and Ann Miller.

Touring shows readied by Detroit Youththeatre

Sept. 22 through Oct. 10: "Tolens Tales," a collection of American Indian folktales told by Chicago's Melkin Puppet Theatre's giant hand and rod puppets — for grades K-6.

Sept. 29 through Oct. 10: "The Magic Word," performed by New York's Periwinkle Productions, in a musical visit to the fantasy land of poetry — for grades K-6.

OCT. 20-31: "Teddy Roosevelt," a fully staged musical production presented by Performing Arts Repertory Theatre of New York City, focusing on the early life of one of America's greatest presidents — for grades 4-9.

Nov. 3-7: "The Sorcerer's Apprentice and Other Magical Tales" with New York's master-puppeteer Marshall Keen — for grades K-6.

Nov. 3-11: "Beans," a musical comedy dealing with human communication in a light-hearted history romp, presented by the Biloxi, Miss. Sheffield Ensemble Theatre — for grades 4-9.

Dec. 1-5: "The Story of the Nutcracker," a holiday classic performed by the Bob Brown Marinettes of Washington, D.C. — for grades K-6.

Dec. 1-5: "Everybody, Everybody," New York's award-winning Paper Bag Players in its debut performance for "Show on the Road" in a music and movement revue — for grades K-6.

Jan. 5-16: "One Plus One," an hour-long introduction to dance from classical ballet to modern mime with a dancer and classical guitarist — for grades K-12.

Jan. 20-30: "The Truck," a company of versatile performers from Chicago in programs ranging from comedy musicals, to folklore, to opera and classic Shakespeare — for grades K-12.

FEB. 23 THROUGH March 6: "African Stories," performed by New York's Performing Arts Repertory Theatre, introducing African heritage and cultures to young audiences through ancient folktales — for grades K-6.

March 23-31: "A Yankee Doodle Dandy," from New York's Producers Foundation Ltd., the story of musical genius and patriot George M. Cohan, with colorful costumes and sets — for grades 4-12.

April 6-16: "Silent Comedy," from New York's Performing Arts Repertory Theatre, scenarios combining mime, clowning, improvisation, dance and comedy — for grades K-6.
