Cadettes set heavy schedule working toward trip to Europe

Cadettes from Girl Scout Troop 410 have set themselves an unusual but ambitious schedule for the next two years. They have a June 1982 target date to set them off on a three-week trip through Switzerland, Germany and Austria.

Paper drives and car washes, the candy decorations, baked goods, crafts and donuts are all on the fall agenda to put money into the travel kitty.

Meanwhile, the 12-15 year olds who meet in Behan Junior High School, will join with other scouts throughout the nation in their annual Girl Scout Council and cookie sales. They will continue to work on their badges, continue to offer girl-power as a community service and start hitting the books to learn German in readiness for their trip.

"ALL TROOPS in the Michigan Metropolitan Girl Scout Council are active ones, but 410 is twice as active as any I know," said Sue Cromwell. Mrs. Cromwell is the oldest Girl Scout Coordinator for the Southwest area of the council, which includes Farmington, Farmington Hills and Novi.

and have their money-making projects for the European tour ready to go in September.

Businesses in the area can expect to receive flyers within the next week or two asking for any job that the girls can handle.

"They have already colated a catalogue for one business in town," Mrs. Cromwell said. "It was a routine job that would have taken away a lot of time from a regular office staff. Maybe there is more of that kind of thing around they could do."

THE CADETTEs are now in the waiting stage pending the final OK from Farmington Hills City fathers and the Oakland Community College (OCC) Board of Trustees to move on plans that will put a Fitness Trail on OCC's Orchard Ridge Campus.

The troop was awarded a \$500 grant from Reader's Digest Magazine, and with another \$1,200 that came from the city, a 10-station exercise trail will be a reality, probably in the spring of 1981.

Walkers through the trail will be given directions, via signs, to walk a balance beam, or jump over a log, for example. Each station will cost \$100-\$200, after the initial 10 are opened, and the goal is 20 stations.

"The girls have pledged to put in one more station each year after the first 10. If any group or individual wants to help us with money on that, we'll do the work. The girls and the (Farmington Area) Jaycees, that is, who have pledged manpower to us," Mrs. Cromwell said.

The Cadettes are particularly anxious to get the Fitness Trail on its way.

They wrote the original request for the grant from Reader's Digest, and wrote and delivered their own speech to the city council.

ORDERS FOR holiday decorations, particularly suitable for subdivisions, churches and public buildings, will be taken throughout September and October with delivery guaranteed on or before Dec. 10. All holly wreaths and garlands on sale are made of fresh materials and sent from the state of Washington.

The Cadettes will also take standing orders for a weekly home delivery of fresh assorted donuts. They are getting a special price on this money-making project from Donut Stop on Eight Mile and Farmington roads and Dunkin' Donuts on 14 Mile and Orchard Lake roads so there is a bit of profit in it for them.

The Cadettes' candy sales run year round, mostly to friends, neighbors and in their own schools.

Bake sales will be conducted in malls and churches and probably in voting precincts on Election Day.

"We'll be all over both cities," Mrs. Cromwell said. "The girls live from 14 Mile and Drake to Eight Mile and Farmington roads, so we're not confined to any one area."
