Lynch & Sons roar — to a halt

The Birmingham Lynch and Sons baseball team roared through the National Amateur Baseball Federation Regional Tournament at St. Clair Shores last week — until it reached the final round.

Lynch and Sons won four consecutive games in the tournament, scoring 43 runs on 50 hits, before falling on Saturday to Detroit ITM 6-5 and 8-0.

ITM had the early advantage in the first game of the final round, leading 2-0 going into the sixth inning. Tim Schaefer and Chuck Wagner, however, got Lynch started with consecutive hits. Mike Jamieson attempted to sacrifice bunt the runners to second and third, but Schaefer was forced at third.

Jim Price followed with a double that

sent Wagner home. Jeff Maher walked, then Randy Wroten doubled Jamieson home. Price was thrown out at the plate attempting to score the tie-breaker.

Lynch pitcher Brian Young gave up two runs in the seventh inning. Young hit a batter, then gave up a home run to Ken Mehall of Michigan State University.

Terry Schultz relieved Young. He gave up a single and two walks, then allowed a run to score on a wild pitch. Mehall got his second home run of the game — a solo shot — in the eighth inning to give ITM a 6-2 lead.

Lynch, however, made it close in the eighth with three runs. Wagner reached on a walk, Jamieson singled, then Joe Maloney singled to drive in one run. Wroten fol-

lowed with a double, and both Jamieson and Maloney scored.

Wroten was out at the plate trying to score the tying run on what the umpire called a wild pitch. The ball had hit the batter, according to Lynch manager Floyd Lasser, and should have been called dead.

Wagner and Wroten led Lynch with two hits each. Wroten finished with three RBIs. Young allowed four hits while striking out two and walking three. Schultz struck out one and walked four. He allowed two hits.

The Lynch bats died in the second game, and Lynch's tournament hopes died with them. Mike Jamieson did have two hits as Lynch fell, 8-3.

Lynch dropped LaDuke of the Detroit

Adray League in the tournament opener Thursday, 11-7, in 10 innings.

Jeff Maher won it for Lynch in the top of the 10th, keying a four-run rally with a double. Maher had three hits for the game. Jamieson had two hits and five RBIs. Price had two RBIs.

Lynch pounded the Pontiac Young Clippers in the team's second game Thursday, 9-4. Mark Pomorski went the distance for Lynch, scattering seven hits while striking out five and walking one.

Wagner and Jamieson had three hits each. Price and Terry Henderson both had two hits. Price had three RBIs, and Jamieson and Maloney had two RBIs each.

Lynch ends its season with a 44-12-1 record.

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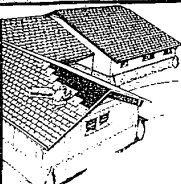
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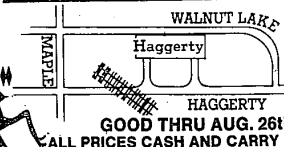
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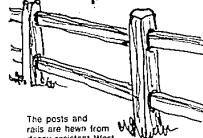
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
