## Hit-run victim in fair condition; family seeks info

He has yet to return home from motorcycling with a friend on July 31.

The 29-year-old Redford Township resident was about five minutes away from his Kinloch home shortly after 10 p.m. when an unknown driver in a 1976 champagne-clored Ford Thunderbird crossed the double yellow line on Inkster Road at Bell Creek Park.

His father, 67-year-old John Hughes, could not handle the sight of his son in a hospital bed mairned. He suffered cardiac arest and had to be rushed to emergency for treatment. "I've been checking the newspaper classifieds looking for anyone trying to sell a Thunderbird," he said. "I've checked on three of them so far, one which was even the same color as the decription of the hit-run auto, but I ha-ven't had any luck yet."

HE SAID the family also has acquired the services of a Southfield hypnotist to work with one witness in an attempt to draw a license plate number of the hitrun car from the witness'

"The witness remembers looking at the car's license plate, but everything happened fast and he can't remember the number. The witness did provide a clicense plate number under the first hypnosis session and police played with the numbers in an attempt to come up with a registered owner, to no avail.

"The hypnotist told me he would try again and is confident a second session will result in the witness recalling the license plate number," James said. The family has requested citizen as-

sistance in the investigation and has of-fered a \$1,000 reward to anyone pro-viding information leading to the ar-rest and conviction of the hit-run driv-er. "The unreal part of this whole thing is that the guy just took off and left Ray to die," said Mrs. Hughes. 'I can't deal with that, and I won't deal with it. I don't even think he (her husband) could deal with it right away.

"HE HAS asked about the other goy, but he doesn't know he was hit by a hit-and-run driver, and we won't tell him because I don't think he could handle it psychologically." he said. "The fighting for Ray's life and that's the only thing I want to deal with. 


