State lives in museum

Across the street from the State Capitol, students can get a special taste of the state's history that takes them from the present back to the glacial ages. Michigan history "comes alive" in a display at the Michigan Historical Museum's new location at 208 N. Capitol Ave. in Lansing A chronological arrangement of photographs, artifacts and drawings takes visitors from the present beach through the

The display covers the development of the automobile, the logging, pharmaceutical, furniture and breakfast food indus-tries, the Civil War, the American Revolution, fur trappers, French voyagenst, the British, Indians and early settlers in Michigan. These are all represented by photographs and arti-faction.

In a special display, students can fest their ability on an early 1900s typewriter and other household items of the times. The museum is operated by the History Division of the Department of State and is open from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and from noon to 4:30 p.m. Saturdya and Sunday, Admission is free.

SEMCOG approves GM roads

New roads requested by General Motors Corp. for access to its new auto plant in froin Township will be eligible for federal funding. The Southeast Michigan Council of Government's (ESMCOG) Executive Committee last week voted unanimously to include roads near the plant site in the Federal Aid Urban System (FAUS). FAUS is a network of significant roads in an urban area. Roads included in the system are eligible for Federal Highway Administration

funds. Federal funding requirements include approval from regional planning agencies like SEM-COG.

The executive committee added parts of Silver Bell, Giddings, Joslyn and Brown roads to the FAUS. Preliminary engineering on paving, widening and bridges for parts of the roads were also added to SEM-COG's Transportation Improvement Program.


More than \$500,000 in federal funds and \$151,000 in local funds

are available for the preliminary engineering which will be complet-ed by the Oakland County Road Commission.

Total project cost of the road im-rovemnts is an estimated \$16 mil-

provemnts is an estimated \$16 mil-lion.
The SEMCOG action was request-ed by General Motors, the state De-partment of Transportation and Oakland County.
The plant is expected to be open by the summer of 1982.
