A Regular Meeting of the Farmington City Council was held August 18, 1980 in the Council Chambers, 28400 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan. The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Mayor William S. Hartsock.

PRESENT: Mayor Hartsock, Councilmen Buckler, and Tupper.

ABSENT: Councilmen Bennett and Yoder.

CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Mgr. Deadman, Dir. Billing, Dir. Seifert, City Clerk Viane.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.

Permission was granted to March Tire Company for sign variance.

Permission was granted to Lucy's Oldies and Goodies for Antique Sale.

Permission was granted to Old Village Association for Street Sale.

Proclamation was issued supporting the Jerry Lewis Muscular Dystrophy Telethon.

Council received petition from residents on Oakland and Macomb Streets regarding maintenance of alleyway and authorized filling low areas in the alley and cutting some of the overgrowth which has occurred.

City Mgr. Deadman advised Council of Detroit Board of Water Commissioners new approved water rates.

Council agreed to erect a traffic sign on Maple indicating "Handicapped Child in Area" at the request of Mr. Lawrence Miller, 22835 Maple.

Upon recommendation from the Planning Commission, Ordinance C-488-80, which would rezone a 14 acre parcel on the southeast corner of Farmington Road and Nine Mile from M-2 Industrial to ERO Education-Research-Office District, was introduced.

City Manager Deadman advised that the Department of Public Safety had received a request to transfer an SDM license from Herbert and Christine Neiff to Massoud T. Zeinoun at Tony's Party Store, located at 30790 Grand River.

City Manager Deadman was instructed to arrange for a presentation by the E.P.A. Noise Specialist and to contact the City of Farmington Hills to see if they would be interested in a joint meeting to hear this presentation.

City Manager Deadman was authorized to sign a new contract with the Community Development Block Grant Program.

Council authorized payment of \$80,885.02 to McCarthy Contracting of Novi, Michigan, for work completed through August 4, 1980.

Council authorized waiving the bid process and accepting the proposal of Detroit Concrete Products in the amount of \$3,896.50 for the repair of various streets within the city.

Council authorized a Change Order to the 1980 Road Improvement Program which would add 535 lineal feet of curb to the contract with McCarthy Paving Contractors, at a cost of \$5,350.00 and also authorized the transfer of \$5,350.00 from the Unappropriated Surplus account of the General Fund to the Local Street Fund.
