When harmonica players convene at a convention, they are collectively known as 'harmonicists'. It's understandable. Call them 'harmonica buffs' and it sounds like a secret society that plays the instrument in the nude. "Harmonicists" is what Gordon Mitchell, a Southfield resident and president of the Society for the Preservation and Advancement of the Harmonica (SPAH), calls the 1,500 harmonica playing members of the organization.


