

Human rights draws no party line

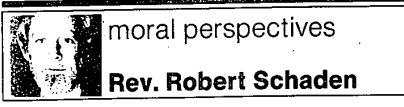
Even in a summer heated by a wave of political differences there are some issues which, at least in principle, cross party lines.

Whether we be Democrat, Independent or Republican, "Human Rights" make up a plank on which we all claim to stand. Thus regardless of party affiliation we are equally indignant over the misery of villagers in Afghanistan or the plight of hostages in Iran.

The emotionalism is only a few decades lower when we turn to such issues as the rights of American auto workers versus the foreign car market. In fact the front pages of the nation's dailies are filled with stories of human rights infringements to be by thugs, or gangs or governments.

However, the Trans, the Afghans, the Brazils, the muggings, the child snatchings and the economic shenanigans are as predictable and understandable as they are abhorring.

THE INFRINGEMENT of human rights at the upper echelons of society or at the hands of criminal elements is

really no different than the human manipulation which takes place, and which often goes unnoticed, in the factories and the families of everyday life at a seemingly insignificant level.

That we reap what we sow is no less surprising than it is true.

The ability to use people in order to obtain things or to manipulate people in order to create a world which fits our designs is not learned in the university or powerful places.

Rather it is learned in the one-room school houses of family units, the one-on-one relationships of life and in the any number of social, church and business groups where people rub shoulders

of a particular church group or corresponding secretary of the local bowling league.

We have a way of seeing very closely what we want and then becoming quite blind to the fact that we step all over people to get the predetermined prize.

Even our own little world becomes a chess board of sorts where we employ any number of people as pawns in order to save our King or kill off the other person's King.

The news events of human rights infringement which will appear in tomorrow's newspapers will be perpetrated by powerful people who are today's children. And the only major difference between them and ourselves will be the place of power they hold.

The fact that they will be able to justify their actions should be no more surprising than the fact we so readily justify our own. And that some of them will not recognize their shenanigans as human manipulation will be no more than the basic dynamics of the petty conniving of everyday life let loose on a larger scale.
