Kalamazoo nets locals

West Bloomfield, Birmingham and Rochester have more than equal representation on sports teams at Kalamazoo College this year.
On the rosters of the cross country, field hockey, football, golf, soccer and volleyball teams are 25 local athletes.

Kalamazoo, a member of the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association, is the league leader in total championships won in all sports even though awards no athletic scholarships.
Harrier John Canar of Rochester, a sophomore in Kalamazoo's cross country team, is joined this year by freshman prospects Robert Alexander, Southfield, and Mike Bronzo, Rochester Adams.

The team took fifth place last year with a 2-4 league record.
Cindy Ackerman, Judy Kisor and Martha Clippert from Kingswood High School along with Anita Baby, Bloomfield Hills Keeser will help out the field hockey team.

Any help will be appreciated, as the team was 0-6 league play and 1-10 overall last year.

Juniors Tony Asher, defensive back, and Pat Vaharty, wide receiver, are Birmingham Brother Rice alumni on the Hornets' football team. Former Rochester Adams students Mitch Aiello, linebacker/defensive end, and Jack Lawless, defensive tackle, are sophomores on the squad.

WIDE RECEIVER Dan Jones from Bloomfield and over will provide experience as a senior.

Offensive guard Paul Owens and center Doug Mack, both from Bloomfield Hills Lahser, are freshman prospects.

The Hornets' record of 2-3 in the league and 5-3 overall earned them fourth place in the MIAA.
Only one lineman is returning, leaving the Hornets with a monumental rebuilding job.

Mike Asher, a sophomore from Brother Rice, will help guide the golf team's season. The team took fifth in MIAA play last year.

SEVERAL LOCAL SOCCER players will join athletes from Finland, Ghana, West Germany and Japan this year.

Included are senior David Emery, Birmingham Cranbrook; juniors Michael Malinowski, Adams, and Dan Minkus, Birmingham Groves; sophomore Ron-Pierre Pazevic, Adams.

Freshmen on the squad are Jim Jones, Andover; Robert Muns, Farmington Harrison; Andrew Perrin, Detroit Country Day and John Sedor, Southfield Christian.

The Hornet soccer team finished third in the conference last year.
Athena Kalevas, Academy of the Sacred Heart, and Lisa Welsh, Kingswood, will join the volleyball team's effort this year.

Coached by Rutliff Meyer, the squad earned fifth place last year.

New coach leads Cranbrook

If coaching expertise can be picked up by osmosis, then Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook got itself a pretty good deal.
Cranbrook's new head football coach, Mike Leu, comes to the school after having spent four years as the head freshman coach for Birmingham Brother Rice.

That's four years spent on the staff of one of the more successful football programs around.
Leu comes to a team with six returning senior lettermen. Two of those lettermen — defensive end Tim Hazen and offensive guard

Andy Sloan — were both All-Metro Conference picks last year.
Other senior lettermen include linebacker Eric Mazzeo, linebacker and running back Scott Estes, nose guard Leighton Brown, and defensive back and running back Mark Jones.

TAKING OVER AT quarterback this year for the Cranes will be junior Mark LaFontaine. LaFontaine started for the Cranbrook Jayvee team last year. Leu said LaFontaine is a sprintout quarterback, and that he would be directing a triple option, veer offense.
On defense, Cranbrook will run what Leu calls a 5-0-Eagle formation. He explained the

formation is basically a 5-2, but every down lineman on the weak side of the field shifts, putting the tackle over the offensive guard and the end over the offensive tackle.
The offense — the veer — is old hat at Cranbrook, but the defense and the coach are new.

And the defense and the coach are not the only new twists to Cranbrook football. The Cranes will compete in two leagues this year according to Leu. They will still be in the Metro Conference, but they will also compete in the newly formed North Oakland Athletic Conference against Avondale, Brandon and Oxford.

"EVERY GAME WE play we'll be in a league game," said Leu. "We have a chance for two league championships this year."

Moving to the NOAC represents a step up, not necessarily in quality but in size, for Cranbrook. All the teams in the NOAC are Class B.


"As far as the points and that (to determine state playoff berths)," said Leu, "we're happy to be playing the larger schools."

"The kids are excited about it, playing the larger schools," said Leu, "but we know we've got a challenge in the Metro Conference."
Cranbrook opens its season at 7:30 p.m. Friday at Oxford.




