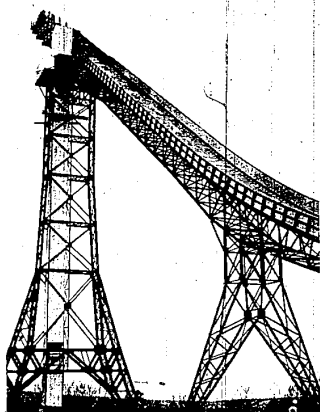

### Legislators To Aid In Dedication

LANSING  
Rep. Leonard Walton, Chair-

man of a joint House-Senate committee to host the International Ski Flying Meet at Copper Peak, Ironwood, February 27, 28 and March 1, has announced the appointments to the committee.

Committee members are: Sen. Gordon Rockwell, Vice-chairman; Sen. Harvey Lodge; Sen. Basil Brown, Sen. Joseph Mack, Sen. George Kuhn, Rep. Russell Hellman, Rep. George F. Montgomery, Rep. Charles Varnum and Rep. John Payant.

Nearly 40 "flyers" from 13 foreign nations and the United States are scheduled to participate in the inaugural meet. The new flying hill is one of five such facilities in the world and the only one in the Western Hemisphere.

The jump is scheduled to become the hub of sky jumping school and may serve as the training base for U.S. Olympic teams. Some portion of future Olympics may be held on the site.

It is operated as a non-profit organization by the Gogebic Range Ski Club which hopes to use the facility as a sight-seeing attraction in the summer. The jump site and other on-site facilities have already proved a major attraction for area tourists.

## See 600-Foot Leap Possible At UP's New Ski Flying Hill

Ski flying - the big step above ski jumping will become a reality in Michigan this winter. Construction of "Copper Peak," the only ski flying hill in the Western Hemisphere, has been completed near Ironwood in the Upper Peninsula.

"Copper Peak" becomes the fifth such ski flying complex in the world, the other four being located in Europe.

The first sanctioned ski flying tournament is scheduled for February 27, 28 and March 1. Invitations have been sent to 17 countries, inviting their top jumpers to participate.

Most of the competitors will come from foreign countries since few U.S. jumpers have had experience on the huge ski-flying hills.

To date, 12 foreign nations have promised entries. These include: Austria (4), Canada (2), Czechoslovakia (4), Finland (2), West Germany (2), Hungary (2), Italy (1), Japan (3), Norway (2), Yugoslavia (3), Poland (3) and the USSR (4).

A field of 32 international jumpers is assured. This is a good showing when you consider that there are only about 100 competitors in the world.

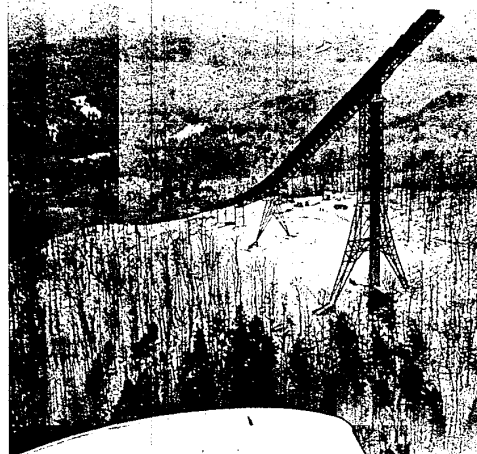
Starting from chutes cantilevered behind the main support tower, the flyers will shoot down the 120 meter in-run and soar into space at 65-75 miles per hour over a 500 foot landing area, making a vertical drop of over 600 feet. Flights of 400 to 600 feet are possible.

THIS IS SKI flying - the same thing you saw on television if you watched "Wide World of Sports" when they covered the meet at Oberstdorf, West Germany.

On the program you saw how the ski fliers projected themselves through the air - heads down and ski tips up, with their bodies almost horizontal to the earth.

By so doing, they form an air foil to ride the cushion of air beneath them. Their hands and arms are used like a rudder to steer themselves for more speed and distance.

Invitations have been extended to President Nixon, as well as many U.S. and foreign officials and diplomats. The Governors and Senators from Michigan, Wisconsin and Min-

nesota are expected. Michigan's "Miss America" will be in attendance.

Ticket orders should be directed to the Copper Peak tournament headquarters in Ironwood, Mich. There is a savings in the price if tickets are purchased for the entire three days.

Tickets for single day events are as follows: Friday, Feb. 27 (Adults \$5 - Children \$3) - Saturday, Feb. 28 (Adults \$5 - Children \$3) and Sunday, March 1 (Adults \$10-Children \$5). The combined three-day tickets are (Adults \$18 - Children \$9).

Ticket sales are being limited to 15,000 for each day of the event. For assistance with

reservations for accommodations contact the Chamber of Commerce in Ironwood. This event will provide an opportunity for local metropolitan residents to see how the "other half" of Michigan lives in the Winter Wonderland.

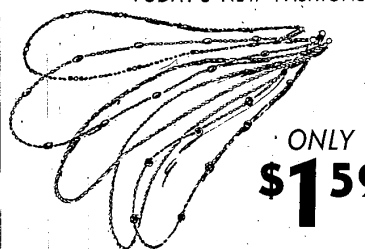
