



## See 600-Foot Leap Possible At UP's New Ski Flying Hill

Ski flying - the big step above ski jumping will become a reality in Michigan this winter. Construction of "Copper Peak," the only ski flying hill in the Western Hemisphere, has been completed near Ironwood in the Upper Peninsula.

"Copper Peak" becomes the fifth such ski flying complex in the world, the other four being located in Europe.

The first sanctioned ski flying tournament is scheduled for February 27, 28 and March 1. Invitations have been sent to 17 countries, inviting their top jumpers to participate.

Most of the competitors will come from foreign countries since few U.S. jumpers have had experience on the huge ski-flying hills.

To date, 12 foreign nations have promised entries. These include: Austria (4), Canada (2), Czechoslovakia (4), Finland (2), West Germany (2), Hungary (2), Italy (1), Japan (3), Norway (1), Yugoslavia (2), Poland (3) and the USSR (4).

A field of 32 international jumpers is assured. This is a good showing when you consider that there are only about 100 competitors in the world.

Starting from chutes cantilevered behind the main support tower, the fliers will shoot down the 120 meter in-run and soar into space at 65-75 miles per hour over a 500 foot landing area, making a vertical drop of over 600 feet. Flights of 400 to 600 feet are possible.


