

# How To Smile

**SOUTHFIELD** "Candid Camera" isn't the name of the show and some of the participants have difficulty smiling but students in speech classes at Oakland Community College's Orchard Ridge Campus in Farmington do have the opportunity of performing before a video taping camera.

According to Mrs. Joan Leininger, assistant professor of speech, the program of video taping students' speeches was designed to provide a motivation tool. "The students can look at the playback of themselves and they can see what they're doing wrong which can be more effective

than just explaining their difficulties." Mrs. Leininger said at present video taping is being used in four speech classes: public speaking, oral interpretation, fundamentals of speech and debate.

"The students are filmed and recorded at the beginning of the course and a piece of blank tape is left on the reel so that toward the completion of the class they are re-taped," she said.

Mrs. Leininger explained that this way the students get a "before and after" view of themselves and they can see the progress they have made.

"The video taping allows for objective self-criticism on the part of the speaker." IN THE LAST seven semesters more than 1,000 students have benefited from video taping their speeches.

"The video taping goes one step further than audio taping, for the student not only can hear his speech, but he can also see how he delivers it—if he doesn't stand straight, if he fails to have eye contact, what he does with his hands."

Mrs. Leininger said that students also have the opportunity of checking out audio tape cartridges and record their speeches. "These they can play back in the speech laboratory to work on self-improvement."
