

Mime Teaches U-D Session

Geoffrey Buckley, noted mime from Coventry, England, will teach three classes in mime at the University of Detroit Feb. 20 and 21.

Buckley's U-D workshop, sponsored by the University's Theatre Department will consist of a Friday evening class of "Commedia Dell'Arte Characters"; a Saturday morning class of "Improvisation and the Technique"; and a final Saturday afternoon class titled "Comedy Timing and Rhythm."

Both a mime and lecturer, Buckley studied with Claude Chagrin in London.

Registration for the workshop, to be held in the U-D Memorial Building, is limited to theatre and dance students at the college level. The fee for the workshop is \$7 for U-D students and \$10 for others.

Police Work At Being 'Pros'

A banquet to honor the graduates from the Scientific Criminal Investigation Seminar was held Thursday in the Plymouth Meeting House, Plymouth.

The seminar (two one-week sessions) was held in the Plymouth State Home for the last two weeks with classes taught by experts in their various fields of medicine and criminal investigation techniques.

Police officers from the six Overland communities as well as the surrounding communities in Western Wayne County attended.

The school for the 146 officers was the idea of the Wayne County Association of Chiefs of Police. Their plans were supported by the Michigan State Police.

Planning the seminar were police chiefs Robert Behrendt, Garden City; Herbert W. Straley, Plymouth; and Garrison Clayton, Westland. They constitute the training committee for the chief's association.

In his 10 minute speech, Brickley praised the officers for trying to better themselves and for aspiring to move to higher positions in their police departments.

Brickley said the source of knowledge, as evidenced by the seminar, will add to the power and effectiveness of the police officers. "The man who knows what he is doing is way ahead of the rest," he said.

The officer has to know evidence and how to present it to be effective, he said. The only way we can grow is through professionalism, Brickley said.

THE PROFESSIONALISM Brickley spoke about was apparent in the advanced level of

education the officers were exposed to. The age of the night stick has long passed, he said.

Included in the 40-hour seminar were classes in evidence, voice identification, neutron activation analysis, the polygraph, pathological analysis and the identification of skeletal remains.

The classes were taught by officers from the Michigan State Police crime labs throughout the state and by doctors from the University of Michigan and several clinics in the state.

SEMCOG Backs Off Parochialism

"SEMCOG needs to take on some of the thorny issues of the day to keep alive," said its new chairman, Detroit Common Council President Mel Ravitz, in his acceptance speech.

Shortly thereafter the 65 delegates of member units, of the Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) adopted a position on the governor's education reform proposals.

But they deleted the two most thorny items of 10 suggested.

THEY REFUSED to oppose state aid to non-public schools, which the governor recommends and which is receiving hot and close debate in the Legislature.

And they refused to support the principle of state aid to local district capital outlay and debt retirement programs, which the governor left out of his recommendations but which school administrators consider crucial.

These items were brought to the SEMCOG general assembly at its annual organizational meeting Saturday by the education bloc of member units.

They represented the first test of education bloc projects under staff education division Director Benton Yates former Livonia Schools superintendent. Yates had held the staff post just six months.

ABOLISHMENT OF the elected State Board of Education and replacement with a board appointed by the governor was endorsed by SEMCOG.

The delegates also supported appointment of a state schools superintendent by such a state board, reorganization of intermediate school districts into a fewer number, without changing Wayne, Oakland or Macomb intermediate districts; and choosing of an intermediate district superintendent by the board of each.

Most controversial of their positions will probably be their endorsement of a state-wide property tax limitation for the basic foundation school programs, with local districts to have prerogatives of locally raising additional millage for desired enrichment.

They also endorsed eliminating K-8 districts of all and going to all Kindergarten through 12 districting with state board prerogative to assure that each K-12 district be "adequately sized."

They endorsed multiple level financing of vocational-technical programs for K-12 students and the principle of local budgeting of all funds.
