Specifically, the cars will be used in a scene to be shot at Wilcox Lake early Spet, 19. This scene will involve the finding of a dead body, that of a runaway ten-ager.
"It won't be done exactly like real life," said the police chief. The murder scene calls for umpte-ump police cars and men.
"Basically, our responsibility will be a assist the film crew and make things move the way they want it to. They want us to close the park to only the extras and service club members, but they want traffic in the background."

Ms. Kelley said the murder scene will be introduced about 29 percent of the way into the film, but the film is "not about murder itself but about making a difficult decision and its effect on the Malden family."

"It's about a moral issue and the First Amerendment right. The murder part is the strongest issue we could come up with," Ms. Kelley said.
