To most people Ruth Marie Henke was just a normal citizen.
 She and her husband, Arno, raised three sons and two daughters in Farmington. Mrs. Henke was active also in church groups and social clubs.
 But when she died Sept. 5, at age 76, her husband of almost 56 years called it "a cruel blow. She was never sick."
 "I wouldn't say that none were as good as she, but she was something special to us and to the family," Henke said.
 Mrs. Henke was a quiet activist in senior citizen clubs and an industrious member of the Farmington branch of the Michigan Cancer Society.
 She was a vice president of the senior's drop-in center at the Masonic Temple in Farmington and secretary of the Senior Citizens Social Club of

Farmington, which met in the First United Methodist Church of Farmington.
 "She was a lovely, gracious woman, beautiful in every way," said Loretta Conway, head of the Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation seniors program.
 The president of the Senior Citizens Social Club, Marie Faunce, remembers Mrs. Henke as the sort of vice president who willingly took care of the details which helped the club run smoothly.
 "SHE WAS VERY helpful. She did what you wished her to," said Mrs. Faunce.
 "I'm going to miss her. She was very nice."
 The Henkes would have celebrated their 56th wedding anniversary on

Sept. 17. They met through a social club at a Methodist church in Detroit. Henke's father, a Methodist minister, performed the wedding ceremony.
