

New Lutheran church sets first services

Residents from the communities of Farmington and Novi will meet Sunday morning for the first worship service of Novi Area Lutheran Church. The new Lutheran congregation will be meeting in Novi Middle School North, on Taft Road, south of Grand River. Services begin at 10 a.m.

In addition to worship services, the congregation will offer Sunday School classes for school age children, beginning immediately after the worship service.

The start of services for Novi Area Lutheran Church is the culmination of a church development program sponsored by Michigan District Mission Board of Wisconsin Evangelical Lu-

theran Synod.

The board initiated spot survey work in areas of Novi through the summer of 1979 with Tony Brinkman, a student at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary.

In July it called Rev. David Farley to be resident pastor and developer of the Novi congregation.

THE MOST visible part of Pastor Farley's work has been the community canvass work conducted by the church's growing nucleus and members of sister congregations.

"The community response to our canvass has been exceptional," Pastor Farley said. "At door after door we received encouraging words and often signs of interest in our work."

The church plans to continue canvass work on different dates in the fall. "Warm dates," Pastor Farley added.

Other organizational matters such as finding a place to meet for worship services have kept the young congregation busy. The church received permission from the Novi School Board to use a classroom of Middle School North, a former high school.

"We have also held two informational meetings," Pastor Farley said. "These are intended for anyone who wishes to find out more about us before necessarily getting involved. Once we have services underway, we plan to schedule two more such meetings for the public."

"Right now, we are focusing on our first service and are encouraging people to come a little before 10 a.m. to have a chance to meet one another."

THE WISCONSIN Synod, the parent organization of the new church, adheres to the Bible as the inspired inerrant Word of God and represents a conservative confessional tradition in the Lutheran Church.

It places a high emphasis on education and maintains one of the largest elementary school systems among protestant church bodies.

The church body is comprised of 1,100 congregations throughout the U.S., although its name still reflects its midwestern beginnings in 1849.

Holy Days services listed

"Ideas That Changed the World" is the theme for reflection and discussion chosen by Rabbi Sherwin Wine for the High Holy Days in Birmingham Temple, 28611 12 Mile Road, Farmington.

The High Holy Days, a 10-day festival, begins with Rosh Hashana and ends with Yom Kippur, Sept. 10-20.

Rabbi Wine's sermon for Rosh Hashana evening, at 8:30 p.m. is called "Freethinking." This is followed by "Naturalism" at 10:30 a.m. Rosh Hashana morning, Thursday, Sept. 11.

Yom Kippur evening service, at 8:30 p.m. Friday, Sept. 19 is called "Evolution," followed by the morning service, at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, called "Humanism."

Yom Kippur Memorial is set for 4:30 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 20. Service for the day is called "Progress."

Community Bible class begins fall sessions

About 200 persons are expected to gather at 9:30 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 11 in Christ Church Cranbrook for the fall session of Community Bible Class taught by Margaret Hess. The church is located at 470 Church Road, Bloomfield Hills.

Mrs. Hess is the wife of Dr. Bartlett L. Hess, senior pastor of Ward Presbyterian Church, Livonia, and has been teaching Bible classes in the Detroit area for 24 years.

She has co-authored two books with her husband, "How to Have a Giving Church," and "The Power of a Loving Church." She is the author of "Love Knows No Barriers," a book on Ruth, and "Esther: Courage in Crisis."

This year her class will study Genesis to Deuteronomy, and Job. The course goes through the entire Bible in eight years, taking the books in chronological sequence. From 9:30-9:55 a.m. members meet in small groups to discuss questions on the lesson. From 10-

11 a.m. Mrs. Hess teaches a lesson in a general session.

Mrs. Hess has visited the Bible lands seven times and taught the Bible in the Philippines and India.

She and her husband have just returned from travels in Germany and Italy, conducting tours to the Oberammergau Passion Play.

IN HER teachings, Mrs. Hess seeks to make the Bible come alive through a knowledge of historical and geographical

backgrounds and local customs of the people. She emphasizes practical applications to problems of modern life.

Members in her classes come from all denominations. Study materials on Genesis will be available at 9:15 a.m. on the day of the first class for 50 cents.

A nursery will be provided for preschoolers. Pre-registration to attend the sessions are not necessary.

Sept. 17-23 proclaimed 'Constitution Week'
