coach John Herrington. "They have speed in the backfield and size in the line. I think they have three kids who go 230 pounds or better."

"I think Groves is going to be one of the best teams in the state."

Groves is mostly a running team with three good backs in Ken Grandner, Sam Linetta and Jim Larman. But quarterback Bill Rankin, whose father, Bill Sr., coaches the Falcons, can throw the ball.

Harrison, light and inexperienced in some areas, has a running threat in Ken Kopko, a 190-pound tailback who rushed for 119 yards in 24 carries against Farmington. Senior quarter-

back Jim Macielak threw scoring passes to Steve Waldron and Reggie Upshaw.

Farmington, which was never really out of the game until the last Hawk TD with three minutes left to play, has a throwing quarterback in senior Steve Downey. He made good on eight of 14 passes with three interceptions as Farmington gained 123 yards through the air.

Downey's favorite target was end Tim Cisto, who made four receptions for 57 yards. Downey scored Farmington's only touchdown on a quarterback sneak.

Farmington coach Hal Beardsley praised his defense, especially guard Jim Steiner (10 solo tackles and six as-

sists) and tackle Jim Whitworth (seven solos, four assists).

FARMINGTON HAS its home opener Saturday against West Bloomfield. West Bloomfield, paced by quarterback Kevin Asher and halfback Dan Kenwell, rallied to beat Detroit Mackenzie Friday. Beardsley watched the game.

"They (West Bloomfield) played a big, tough Mackenzie team," he said. "And West Bloomfield stayed with them and won in the fourth quarter."

"So we have a tough ballgame ahead. We have to forget about these mental errors we made against Harrison."

North Farmington spoiled Pontiac

Northern's return to football Friday with a 27-4 triumph in Pontiac's Wiener Stadium. The two Pontiac high schools, Central and Northern, didn't have football last year because of financial problems.

North, which entertains non-league Walled Lake Central Saturday at 2 p.m., sported a couple of quick backs in Doug Schulte and Rick Roth. Schulte (5-10, 185) gained 91 yards in 12 carries and scored two touchdowns on short runs. Roth (6-0, 175) gained 67 yards in 16 tries and scored a touchdown.

North Farmington amassed 145 of its 209 yards rushing in the first half.

HHS runners stomp Central

Brian Anderson covered the 5,000-meter (3.1-mile) Farmington Harrison cross country course in 17:11 to finish first and help the host school outrun Walled Lake Central, 16-39, Tuesday in a non-league meet.

The next three finishers, all from Harrison, were Dave Tremonti (17:31), Dale Black (18:00) and Clay Dillon (18:38). Central's Andy Chinarian finished fifth with a time of 18:46.

In another cross country meet Tues-

day, Farmington High downed Redford Union, 23-36, at Oakland Community College's Orchard Ridge campus. Farmington runners Tom Feiten and Bill Atkinson finished one-two with times of 17:09 and 17:15, respectively.

Rest of the field: RU's Jachim (17:24), RU's Chwanz (17:27) and Farmington's Bill Anglin (17:40).

North Farmington, under new coach Al VanMeter, opened its season with a 15-46 win over Walled Lake Western at Orchard Ridge.

ORDINANCE NO. C-468-80 AMENDMENT NO. 8 TO THE ZONING MAP

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

Section 1: That the territory lying within the City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, be re-zoned as follows:

TIN, RSE, NW ¼ of Section 34, City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan:
Lots 269-320 and Farmington Little Farms Subdivision Lots 1 and 2, excluding the east 351.83 ft. and W. 27 ft. taken for Farmington Road.

FROM: M-2 Industrial District

TO: ERO Educational Research District.

Section 2: The attached map showing the property affected by this Amendment is made a part of this ordinance.

Section 3: This ordinance shall be known as AMENDMENT NO. 8 to the Zoning Map of the City of Farmington, dated May 1, 1976, as amended.

This ordinance was introduced at a regular meeting of the Farmington City Council on August 18, 1980, was adopted and enacted at a regular meeting of the Council on September 2, 1980, and will become effective ten days after publication.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS CITY COUNCIL MEETING SEPTEMBER 8, 1980

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills held a regular meeting September 8, 1980. Present were: Burwell, Lange, Oppertbauer, Soronen, Wolf, Alkatech, and Dolan. Others present were City Manager Savage, City Clerk Cairns and City Attorney Bibeau.

Council approved the minutes of August 18 and August 25, 1980. Special Assessment Roll for road improvement on Inkster Road from Northwestern Highway to Thirteen Mile Road was adjourned to September 22, 1980.

Approval was given to revised Rosen Company Project Plan.

Council enacted Amended Zoning Ordinance C62-A-1 (1) IRO Preamble. Amended Ordinance C62-222 to rezone 23-18-200-213 in the NW ¼ of Section 18 on the west side of Halsted Road south of Twelve Mile Road from RA-1 and L-1 to IRO was enacted.

Revised Final Preliminary Plan of Farmington Place Subdivision in Section 7 was approved.

Necessity Hearing for sewer improvement in SW ¼ of Section 22 (Glen Orchard, Glen Orchard No. 1, Farmington Hills No. 1 and acreage parcels was reset from September 15 to September 22, 1980.

Public Hearing relative to White Motor Project for Economic Development Corporation is set for September 22, 1980.

"Neighborhood Watch" program to organize citizen participation for self-help crime prevention was approved.

An Advisory question on the purchase of a tornado warning system in the amount of \$65,000 to be placed on the ballot for Nov. 4, 1980 was defeated, and approval was given to approve the tornado warning system and funds to be taken from unappropriated surplus.

Resolution of continued support of existing Fire Department Operational Concept was approved.

Resolution requesting a storm drain permit from Wayne County Road Commission for drainage for Garden Court Apartments development on Eight Mile Road was adopted.

Approval was given for continued employment of two Police Department employees whose status of relationship will change through marriage.

Beverly Ellis was reappointed as Resource Representative to the Oakland County Cultural Council.

The following recommendations by the City Manager were approved:

Purchase one truck mounted hydraulic excavator in the amount of \$70,900, one six-ton capacity tilt back trailer, one dump body and salt spreader and annual supply of aluminum sign blanks.

Bid for construction of the Westgate Waterman, S.A.D. C142 was awarded to Pacentr Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$55,550.00, that being low bid.

The low bid of Detroit Concrete Products, Inc., was accepted in the amount of \$12,840 for the Resurfacing project of Folsom Road.

Traffic Control Order No. 2.A.41-80 was adopted reducing the speed limit on Freedom Road from Drake Road westerly to the city limit approximately 3,000 feet to 40 miles per hour.

Council requested City Manager Deadman to establish a meeting with the City's representatives on the Farmington Area Commission on Aging.
