

Register now for day classes at Ten Mile School

With fall just around the corner, the Ten Mile Community School has stepped in just in time by offering classes to occupy the cold months ahead.

From dancing, to office procedures and Holly Hobbie doll making, the school has classes bound to interest just about everyone.

Classes begin the week of Sept. 22. Interested persons may register by completing the accompanying form or by visiting the Ten Mile Road location on weekdays between 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. or 7-9 p.m.

The school is located at 32789 10 Mile, west of Power.

Refunds will be granted when classes are cancelled. All other requests for refunds must be made to the Community Education Office before the second class meeting. A \$2 registration fee will be deducted in the case of withdrawal.

Farmington School District senior citizens (60 or over) are eligible for one free registration except in limited senior classes. A senior citizen card and identification numbers must be procured at the Ten Mile Community School prior to registration.

Babysitting for children 2 to 5 years old is available to parents enrolled in daytime classes at a charge of \$15 for 10-week classes. Babysitting fees are payable at the time of registration. Refunds won't be made unless class is cancelled.

FOLLOWING IS A LIST of daytime classes:

- Dried flower fireside basket arrangement — Wednesday, Oct. 22, from 1-4 p.m. Cost is \$4. Make an attractive arrangement and learn techniques and dimensions that apply to making all types of flower arrangements. Kit is \$12. Please bring newspapers, scissors and wire clippers. Register in advance.

- Holly Hobbie Doll — Wednesday, 10-1 p.m. Room 8. Cost is \$18. Sew an adorable original doll (20 inches) for that little girl in your life. Teacher will provide materials, (choice of colors) and patterns. Most work will be done by hand. Some machine sewing is optional. Bring embroidery scissors, needle and thread. Please see teacher's doll on display at Ten Mile School. Class will run eight weeks, beginning Oct. 1.

- Interior Design — Wednesday, 9:30-11:30. Room 9. Cost is \$18. By means of demonstrations, discussions and field trips, class will receive help in solving home decorating problems. Basic design principles, color combina-

tion, window treatments, and consumer items in purchasing fabric, carpeting and furniture will be covered.

- Money Mystique — Monday, 1-2-3 P.M., Room 10. Cost is \$10. Topics considered: Stock market vs. money markets; bank interest vs. corporate bonds; whole life insurance vs. low cost pure protection; U.S. Series "E" bonds vs. Treasury Bonds; cash value saving vs. mutual fund investing. The importance of estate planning and how to set up a living trust to avoid the cost of probate. Class runs for four weeks.

- Velvet Touchpick Art Workshop — Wednesday, Oct. 23, 1-4 p.m. Cost is \$4. Produce miniature floral painting on velvet background using acrylic paints and touchpicks. Cost of kit is \$8 and includes frame. Students should bring paper, towels and scissors. Register in advance.

- Ceramics — Wednesday, 9:30-11:30. Room 1. Cost is \$18. Basic ceramics techniques using clay. Hand built techniques are taught, no greenware. Decorations and glazing included. Bring a plastic bag to first class (\$8 materials fee due to instructor at first meeting).

- Drawing and Sketching — Friday, 10-12 a.m., Room 1. Cost is \$18. An exploration of drawing methods and materials with emphasis on composition and design. Bring a newspaper pad, approx. 14 by 17, 50 sheets, kneaded eraser, and 3B, 4B drawing pencils.

- Painting, Beginning and Intermediate — Monday, 12:30-3, Room 1. Cost is \$18. Students may use either acrylics or oil. Painting techniques will be pursued that are applicable to either media. Teacher will help with individual needs. Drawing helpful but not necessary. Students to furnish own supplies.

- Stained Glass Art — Wednesday, 1:30-3:30, Room 9. Cost is \$18. Introduction to stained glass art with emphasis on design and construction of sun catchers, window and lamps. Lead and copper foil methods covered. Materials extra.

- Weaving/Macrame — Wednesday, 12:30-2:30, Room 1. Cost is \$18. Work with fibers to learn the techniques of macrame or weaving. Beginners will make sampler wallhanging and other simple projects. Intermediate students will be directed according to individual needs. Suggestions, discussion at first meeting.

- Accounting and Bookkeeping I — Wednesday, 10-12, Room 7. Cost is \$18.

The fundamentals of bookkeeping and principles of accounting procedures will be taught. Books sold at first class meeting. Nine weeks.

- Accounting and Bookkeeping II — Thursday, 10-12, Room 7. Cost is \$18. This class is a continuation of Accounting and Bookkeeping class. The same book is used nine weeks.

- Office Procedures — Monday, 12:30-3, Room 2. Cost is \$20 plus materials.

- Office Procedures — Wednesday, 12:30-3, Room 2. Cost is \$20 plus materials. A total office procedures class designed to provide the student with review and skill development to function in an office. Students will work on business machines, Dictaphone, business forms and filing. Materials cost approximately \$5. Limited to 12.

- Typing, Beginning and Intermediate — Tuesday and Thursday, 9:15-11, Room 2. Cost is \$40. This class meets twice a week for 16 weeks. Class begins Sept. 16. A comprehensive course for those who have had no typing or who have minimum speed. Electric typewriters. Returnable deposit for \$10 required for book.

- Typing Review — Friday, 10-12, Room 2. Cost is \$18. For those who know the keyboard and wish to improve their speed and accuracy. In addition, tabulation, business letters, simple reports, and manuscripts will be covered. Electric typewriters. Bring paper.

- Shorthand Refresher — Tuesday, 1-3, Room 2. Cost is \$18. This is a refresher course in Gregg shorthand. Brief forms will be reviewed. Emphasis is on building speed and transcription skills. Come prepared with notebook, etc.

- Ballet, Beginning — Monday, 4-5, Gym. Cost is \$12. This introductory class is designed for 8- to 11-year-olds and will include warm-up exercises, bar work, and center floor exercises. Children will learn ballet basics and combinations with music. Suggested attire: body leotard and tights or loose clothes that don't confine movement, ballet shoes or heavy footies or socks.

3, Gym. Cost is \$12. A special hour designed for the 4- to 6-year-old in tap, ballet and tumbling. Basic rhythms combined with song and dance routines will delight the beginning youngster. Black body leotard and pink tights preferred.

- Childrens Dance II — Tuesday, 1-2, Gym. Cost is \$12. Continuation of Pre-School Dance I. Children with some dance background in tap, ballet and acrobatics will enjoy this class combining basic rhythms with song and dance routines. Black body leotard and pink tights preferred. Bring outgrown tap shoes for resale.

- Childrens Dance — Intermediate and Advanced. For students previously enrolled in pre-school dance classes. Classes will be set up on Tuesdays if sufficient interest. Please phone. Bring outgrown tap shoes for resale.

- Tap, Beginning — Monday, 5-6, Gym. Cost is \$12. Beginning tap class for 8- to 13-year-olds. Al Gilbert tap technique will be taught as well as combinations. Tap shoes desirable but not necessary; hard soles or socks can be worn.

- Tap, Advanced — Monday, 6-7, Gym. Cost is \$12. For 8- to 13-year-olds, who have had previous tap classes.

- Cake Decorating — Monday, 1:30-3:30, Kitchen. Cost is \$16. Learn the

fundamentals of attractive cake decorating including elaborate borders, flowers and creative designs. Make cakes for different occasions. Small materials fee. Bring notebook and pencil. Eight weeks.

- Chinese Cooking — Wednesday, 10-12, Kitchen. Cost is \$18. Chinese instructor will show you how to use supermarket items to prepare and cook delicious Chinese meals. Dishes will include snacks, appetizers, and entrees. Materials fee of \$10 is due at first session.

- Gourmet European Cooking — Tuesday, 1-3, Kitchen. Cost is \$16. European instructor will provide easy-to-prepare menus with accompaniments and serving suggestions. Planning, preparation and cooking methods for
