SEALED BIDS for the purchase of tax anticipation notes of Clarenceville School District, Counties of Oakland and Wayne, Michigan of the par value of \$725,000.00 will be received by the undersigned at Clarenceville Administrative Offices, 20210 Middlebelt Road, Livonia, Michigan until 8:00 o'clock P.M. Daylight Saving Time, on the 25th day of September, 1980 at which time and place they will be publicly opened and read.

NOTE DETAILS, INTEREST RATE, PAYING AGENT, AND DENOMINATIONS: The notes will be dated October 1, 1980, will mature March 21, 1981 and will bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding 8% per annum. Both principal and interest will be payable at a bank or trust company located in the State of Michigan to be designated by the original purchaser of the notes which paying agent qualifies as such under the Statutes of the State of Michigan or of the Federal Government, subject to the approval of School District. Denominations and form of notes to be at the option of the purchaser. Accrual interest to date of delivery of such notes must be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery.

PRIOR REDEMPTION: The notes shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity.

AWARD OF NOTES: For the purpose of awarding the notes the interest cost of each bid will be computed on a 360 day year basis by determining, at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the notes from October 1, 1980. (Here insert the sale date or the date of the notes, whichever is later), to their maturity and deducting therefrom any premium. The notes will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation produces the lowest dollar interest cost to the municipality. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the notes or at a price less than their par value will be considered.

SECURITY: The loan is in anticipation of the operating portion of the School Tax for the fiscal year July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981 which tax is due and payable December 1, 1980. The School District is required to establish a special fund to be used solely to pay the principal and interest on the notes when due, and to set aside in said fund an amount sufficient to repay the principal and interest on the notes when due. In addition, the notes will be a General Obligation of the School District and if tax collections are insufficient to pay the notes when due, the School District has pledged to use any and all other resources available for payment of said notes. The School District does not have the power to levy taxes for the payment of the notes in excess of its constitutional and statutory tax rate limit.

GOOD FAITH: A certified or cashier's check in the amount of 2% of the par value of the notes, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company and payable to the order of the Treasurer must accompany each bid as a guarantee of good faith on the part of the bidder to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the notes. Checks of unsuccessful bidders will be promptly returned.

LEGAL OPINION: DELIVERY OF NOTES: Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified opinion of the purchaser's attorney approving the legality of the notes, to be secured at the purchaser's expense. The purchaser shall furnish notes ready for execution at his expense. Notes will be delivered at a place to be agreed upon with the purchaser.


