do have some control over your appearance."

Murray's interest in the system began about 10 years ago when he began investigating such philosophies as body language.

Mann describes as "a holy way to do it but it's the fastest and easiest way."

Once the songwriter picks the chords for his composition, he ought to incorporate those notes into the song, Mann advised.

"After they get out of my course they'll know more than some hit songwriters," he said.

"Songwriters don't have to do too much to be successful. Some of them don't even write music."

Successful writers sometime end up relying on a formula of copying themselves for a succession of hits.
