RALLY AROUND THE flag, kids. The Farmington Area YMCA sponsors a flag football league for Farmington school students in grades 1-5. Registration begins this week immediately after school in each of the schools' gyms. A Y coach will be on hand to register the students. There is a \$14 fee for Y members and a \$16 fee for non-members. Flag football is played like tackle football except players carrying the ball wear two flags in their belts. Play stops when the defensive player grabs the flag. Boys and girls will play on junior varsity teams for grades 1-3 or varsity teams for grades 4-5. Practice sessions will take place once a week in the students' schools. School teams will play others on Saturday mornings from Oct. 4 to Nov. 1 on the

playing field behind Dunckel Middle School. The games will be non-competitive; league standings won't be kept and there are no tournaments involved in the season. For more information, call the Y at 555-4020.

YMCA seeks balance in win/lose attitude

Editor: Several national youth sports programs have come under fire in the past few years for the win-at-any-cost attitude they seem to engender. Youngsters are put under enormous pressure by overzealous coaches and parents to win and are publicly criticized for their mistakes.

This is not so in YMCA youth sports

programs. Whether it be flag football — which begins this week — or basketball, floor hockey or T-ball, Y programs seek to de-emphasize the importance of winning. This is not to say that young Y participants don't try to win. But in Y youth sports, a serious attempt is made to put winning and losing in proper perspective.

Because parents and coaches are

usually the major culprits, all Y youth sports programs are designed to include values sessions with both coaches and parents before the season begins and often during the season as well. We think the YMCA is on the right track. Like the Y, we think the key element in youth sports should be the sheer fun of playing the game. Competition is fun. But, for the average
