

Artist raises funds for Lupus Foundation with one-man show

Artist Bob Duchin sets up a one-man show Tuesday through Thursday, in Birmingham Temple to raise funds for the North Woodward Suburban Chapter of Michigan Lupus Foundation.

"I'll be there for all 36 hours," Duchin said, "to meet any one who wants

to drop in. I'll have more than 400 pieces on view and I work in all media."

Hours are from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. in the temple, 2861 12 Mile Rd. Duchin is an interior designer who works mostly for hotels. He's given a total of 18 shows of his work art, and "this will be the 15th one for a charity," he said.

His work hangs in Metropolitan Museum, New York; Chicago Arts and Science Museum and Los Angeles Museum of Art. He leans toward landscape, though the work he exhibits in the current show runs from modern to realism.

Duchin said he felt "quite honored to be showing in Birmingham Temple because I'm pre-empting a show that congregation is planning for Nov. 15-16," he said.

"Rabbi (Sherwin) Wine is an art collector himself, so he must have been impressed with what I have to say go ahead."
