Tag Days feature the "Dirty Dozen"

On Sept. 26 and 27, music students from the three Farmington area high schools will be highly visible in their marching band uniforms at the various shopping centers and places of business in Farmington and Farmington Hills, collecting funds for TAG DAYS.
