

Chef introduces 'Nouvelle Cuisine'

An entire new concept of gourmet cookery is spelled out in a new cookbook put together by Chef Tom MacKinnon called "A Taste of Nouvelle Cuisine."

The author calls it "an introduction, a forerunner to my first hardback with accent on the sauces and potages that will give a gourmet touch to your next dinner party."

"Nouvelle Cuisine" is translated from the French as 'new kitchen', a facet of food preparation MacKinnon has pursued since his study in Schoolcraft College.

"The introduction was put together in a bit of a hurry," MacKinnon said "to finance my next trip to Europe to see what's new in the field."

MacKinnon will leave his post as executive chef in Holly Hotel, Holly, in mid-October to follow a culinary route with Terry Ciotto who is general manager of Bay Pointe Country Club, through the best eating houses in Europe.

"We've been invited to visit the kitchens of the American team who will be competing in the International Culinary Olympics in Frankfurt, which is a privilege," MacKinnon said, then rattled off another half-dozen three-star restaurants the two have been invited to work in or visit in Belgium and France.

THE EUROPEAN trip to bring back the latest innovations of the culinary arts will culminate with a long-time dream for MacKinnon and Ciotto who met one another while they were both launching their careers.

"We'll finally be working together, sometime in November, when we turn the Grill Room in Bay Pointe into 'Nouvelle Cuisine.'" It will be a something-special cuisine, the finest that can be found in the area, with all the newest recipes we gather in Europe," MacKinnon said.

Through "A Taste of Nouvelle Cuisine" is loaded with recipes the real value of the book, MacKinnon says, is the chapter headings that give information on preparation.

There is also a great many illustrations in the book telling how to cut leaves from cucumbers or flowers from roses to dress up a table.

Something entirely new to dress up a table is the chapter on chocolate decor, again with diagrams, that tells how to create figures from chocolate to decorate a mousse or a cake.

The book also contains a goodly number of quick-to-read graphs telling what meat or poultry is better sautéed, baked or roasted, with suggestions for spices to be used for each.

Solo traveler Jane French will talk about her latest adventures among the Cuna Indians at 7:30 p.m. Sept. 30 at Bloomfield Township Library. The talk will cover Panama, Quito, Ecuador and the Galapagos Islands.

Last February Ms. French visited San Blas, the Pre-Columbian home of the Cuna Indians. The Cunas are a people who have retained their customs despite the intervention of the world media.

After the talk, Mrs. French will show slides of the Cunas who wear gold nose rings, of the Indian markets in Quito and of the Galapagos Islands. There will be time for questions.

Ms. French, head of the business office at Bloomfield Township Library, has traveled alone, searching for untouched places for more than 20 years. She is an experienced traveler with a deep interest in the myriad cultures she has visited and with which she has become acquainted.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS
SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS
CITY COUNCIL MEETING
SEPTEMBER 22, 1980

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills held a regular meeting September 22, 1980. Mayor Soronen opened the meeting at 7:30 o'clock P.M. Members present were: Burwell, Lange, Oppert, Soronen, Wolf, Alkateeb and Dolan. Others present were City Manager Savage, City Clerk Cairns and City Attorney.

Council accepted the Glasser easement for storm sewer construction and confirmed the Special Assessment Roll for road improvement on Inkster Road from Northwestern Highway to Thirteen Mile Road and awarded the contract to Detroit Concrete Products Corporation in the amount of \$138,612.25.

Ordinance C62-226 amendment to the Zoning Map to rezone lots 75 and 76 of Farmington Acres Subdivision from RA-3 to OS-2 was enacted.

Amendment to the Zoning Map-Ordinance C62-228 to rezone parcels 23-32-200-008 and 009, part of 23-33-101-001 and 002, 23-32-101-003, 004, 005 and 006 all located on the south side of Nine Mile Road between Gill and Green Hill Subdivision from RA-1 and RA-3 to RP-2 was enacted.

Council enacted Amendment Ordinance C62-229 to rezone parcel B of 23-33-101-001 and 002 and parcel C part of 23-33-101-003 from RA-3 to RP-2.

A necessity was declared for sewer improvement in the SW ¼ of Section 22, Farmington Hills No. 1, Glen Orchard and Glen Orchard Sub. No. 1 and approval was given the resolution of Intent to Issue Bonds.

October 20, 1980 was the date set for the cost hearing for Sewer Improvement on Onwood Street in Supervisor's Middlebelt & Ten Mile Road Plat No. 2.

Watt & Grayfield water improvement district was established and the Necessity Hearing date was set for October 20, 1980.

Council approved the resolution consenting to transfer of employment from the City of Farmington Hills to the City of Wixom re Landrow Development Company Project (Economic Development Corporation).

Special Assessment district for road improvement on Gilcrest Street in Franklin Knolls Subdivision was not established, consideration will be given after receipt of the Master Storm Drain Report.

Amendment to Hunter's Pointe Planned Unit Development contract was approved. Council approved the amendment to Ordinance C-60 (Penal Code of City Code). Upon the recommendation of the City Manager, the following action was taken: Council waived the requirement of sidewalk installation for a period of one year for the Glasser Building on Inkster Road.

Extended the completion date for the open space plan for the Meadowbrook Park Subdivision until November 1981.

Awarded the contract for necessary cleanup of culverts at Nine Mile Road and Drake Road to Jet Vac Service of Michigan in the amount of \$5,580.

Council accepted the reports on proposal received for performance of economic feasibility study for the construction of low-income Senior Citizen Housing and awarded the study to Larry Wilkinson and Associate at a cost of \$2,500.

Meeting adjourned.
