Mercy High students are semifinalists

More than one million students nationwide entered the Merit Program. The semifinalists announced represent the highest scorers in each state. In addition to being honored publicly, these four students will be specially identified to colleges and universities in the hope of increasing the educational opportunities available to them.

These four local semifinalists will advance to the next round of competition, out of which 14,000 finalists will be named. Of these, 1,000 awards of National Merit \$1,000 Scholarships will be given.

The one-time national awards are allocated on a state representative basis in proportion to the state's number of graduating seniors. Winners of the National Merit \$1,000 Scholarships represent the finalists in each state who are judged by the committee to best combine abilities and personal qualities needed for success during and after college.

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
