## Series offered on hypertension

High blood pressure, or hypertension, is dangerous if not treated properly. It is the leading cause of heart disease, kidney disease and stroke.

There is no way you can tell that your blood pressure is up by the way you feel. Feeling healthy is no guarantee that blood pressure is normal because there are no early warning signs to tell you when your blood pressure is dangerously elevated.

To help you learn more about and live with high blood pressure, the Henry Ford Hospital West Bloomfield Center is offering a six week series of hypertension classes.

Beginning Oct. 15, classes will meet 6-8 p.m. weekly and will cover such topics as diet, exercising, medication and the reasons why hypertension should be controlled.

It will also offer participants an opportunity to discuss their high blood pressure and exchange ideas.
