# 55 small buses, bigger terminal in federal grant

The federal government has approved funds for more small buses and an expanded bus garage in Troy for the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA).

A nearly-\$10.5-million grant will al-low SEMTA to purchase 55 small buses used by the elderly and handicapped in the metropolitan area. Part of the grant will also pay for expansion of SEMTA'S Oakland Terminal at 2021 Barrett in Troy and rehabilisation of four Detroit Department of Transpor-tation stems.

Expansion of the Troy terminal will

Expansion of the Troy terminal will begin next spring.

A SEMTA spokesworman said 29 of the new 12-passenger buses will be added to the Wayne County Advanced Reservation Transit (WAYCART) system; nine will be added to the Oakland County small bus system, and one to Macomb's.

Sixteen of the new buses will be re-lacements. The buses will be in ser-

THE GRANTS were part of a \$17.4-million package announced last week by Theodore Lutz, head of the Urban Mass Transit Administration.

The package includes an initial \$5 million for preliminary engineering surveys for the Woodward Ave. sub-way/surface light-rail line.

The preliminary engineering study will lead to a more accurate cost estimate of the rail line, which is proposed

to run underground from downtown Detroit to McNichols (Six Mile) Road and on surface between Six Mile and Eleven Mile Road in Royal Oak. Soil borings will be taken and station loca-tions will be determined as part of the study.

The light rail line is the major por-tion of SEMTA's proposed \$1.5-billion regional transportation plan.

BIDS FOR the project will be submitted in November, contracts awarded in December, and the study will be
gin in January, SEMTA General Manager Larry E. Salet said.
Preliminary studies are expected to
take up to 20 months, with eventual
cost ranging between \$20 and \$25 million.

Earlier this year the state approved an initial \$950,000 for preliminary en-gineering. The state is expected even-tually to cover 20 percent of the total cost.

Future federal shares of the study are slated during the 1981 and 1982

are slated during the 1981 and 1982 budget years. A \$2-million grant to complete SEM-TA's commuter rail facility in Pontiac, rehabilitate a diesel locomotive and provide for other commuter rail Im-provements was also announced last week.

The commuter rail line runs between Detroit and Pontiac along the Grand Trunk Western Railroad right of way.

Local 1999 of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO, represents 28 maintenance employees on OCC's four campuses and at the administration building.

Local 1999 members received a 53-cents across-the-board increase. They also will make a larger contribution on their prescription drug alter




