# N. Farmington netters lose to Franklin, 4-3

North Farmington could still win the Northwest Suburban League girls' tennis championship, but it won't go undefeated in league play thanks to Livonia Franklin.

Franklin upset North Farmington, 4-3, Monday in an NSL meet on Franklin's courts. North is 3-1 in the league and 7-2 overall.

"It was disappointing," said North coach Norm Stanislawski. "We played poorly. That's about all I can say."

Four of the seven matches lasted three sets. The key match was No. 4 singles where Franklin's Linda Hay downed Karen Madany, 4-6, 6-1, 6-4. Franklin's No. 1 doubles team of Sue Raymond and DeAnna Slovic stopped Stacy Smith and Barb Krone, 6-4, 4-6, 6-4.

## Franklin cagers overcome FHS

Livonia Franklin, with Julie Wilga and Mary Kay McVall leading the way, defeated Farmington High, 57-52, Tuesday night in non-league girls' basketball. Both teams own 4-2 records.

"We played well, but we just couldn't pull it out," said Farmington coach Bob Lekovitch, whose Falcons have been involved in several close games this season.

"We were down by 12 at halftime, but we came back and led by two early in the last quarter."

Wilga, a 5-7 guard, led both teams with 21 points on 10 field goals and one of two free throws. McVall, the team's tallest player at 6-3, added 20 points and pulled down 14 rebounds.

Sue Carruthers, Farmington's 5-8 senior guard, scored 14 points, and teammate Lisa Borchanian added 13. Stacy Green, the Falcons' 6-3 center, got early foul trouble and finished with only four points.

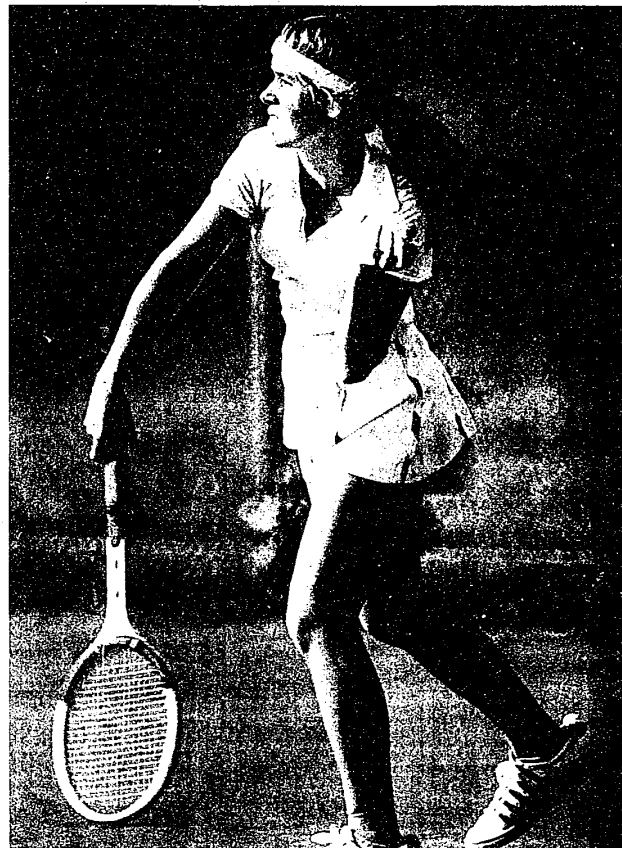

The high school football coaches of Farmington will be hard at work Friday night. They'll be scouting future opponents for the stands, not coaching from the sidelines.

For the first time this season, all three Farmington high schools — Farmington High, Farmington Harrison and North Farmington — will be playing Saturday afternoon games.

North Farmington and Harrison, both unbeaten through four games this season, should have little trouble Saturday as they play the doormats of their respective leagues.

North travels to Redford Thurston for a Northwest Suburban League game, and Harrison entertains Waterford Mott in the Western Six League. Farmington High, winless in four starts, makes the long trip to Milford-Lakeland for an Inter Lakes League game Saturday. All games have 2 p.m. starts.

Coach John Herrington's Harrison squad whipped WSL-foe Northville High, 40-7, Friday. Mott, the Hawks' opponent Saturday, scored the opening touchdown of the game against Livonia Churchill Friday, but the Livonia school posted a 27-6 win.

Ken Grace, Mott's junior quarterback, scored on a six-yard run. Mott (0-4 overall) may have lost the game, but it outlasted Churchill, 116 yards to 69.

Thurston, North's next test, lost 27-4 to Redford Union. The loss dropped the Eagles to 0-4. Steve Samples caught a 20-yard pass from Darryl Hanney for a touchdown, Thurston's first of the 1980 season.
