Buy-American theme dominates Carter's courting of UAW votes

Thousands of UAW members cheered President Jimmy Carter Wednesday as he again called on the American population to buy American made automobiles.

IN RETURN, Carter promised that the auto industry would have "the capi-tal it needs to re-tool, to compete, and to maintain its rightful share of the American auto market."
