

# Bank suspects head for trial

Two men and a woman were bound over for trial in Oakland County Circuit Court last week on charges of robbing a Farmington Hills bank of \$4,700 Sept. 19.

The three, Charles L. Heath, Albert Marshall and Darnell Marshall, all of Detroit, pleaded innocent to bank robbery in the holdup of the Detroit Bank & Trust branch at Grand River and Middlebelt.

Heath and Albert Marshall also were charged with possession of a firearm in the commission of a felony.

Farmington District Judge Michael Hand continued \$25,000 bond on all three defendants.

Police arrested the three just minutes after the holdup, which occurred at 11:20 a.m. The two men were arrested in a field near the bank and the woman in the bank parking lot.

The three are scheduled for arraignments Oct. 21 before Circuit Judge Frederick Ziern.

Heath is out on bond. Albert Marshall is being held in the Oakland County Jail.

Albert Marshall and Darnell Marshall also are being charged by Detroit police with two separate holdups of the Michigan National Bank branch at Telegraph and Grand River. Both occurred in August.

DARNELL MARSHALL, who posted bond on the Farmington Hills charges, is being held in the Wayne County Jail on armed robbery on the Detroit counts.

According to Detroit Police Lt. Wayne Goralski, less than \$10,000 was taken in the two robberies.

No trial date has been set on those charges.

## League discusses ballot proposals

At the general election on Nov. 4, the following proposals will appear on all ballots in Michigan:

• Proposal A — The Smith-Bullard Tax Plan to provide tax relief and shift financing of school operating costs to state income and business property taxes.

• Proposal B — A proposal to lower the legal drinking age from 21 to 19 years of age.

• Proposal C — The Legislative-Executive (Governor's) Tax Plan to shift some of the burden of the property tax to the state sales tax.

• Proposal D — The Tish Tax Plan to cut property taxes in half and require the state to replace, from current state income, revenues lost locally.

• Proposal E — A proposal to finance construction of new prisons by increasing the income tax 0.1 percent for five years.

• Proposal G — A proposal to allow the legislature to pass laws modifying legislators' constitutional immunity from civil arrest and civil process during legislative sessions.
