# Goalie leads OU kickers to national ranking

Rochester goalie Mark Hamilton has played a big role in Oakland University's national soccer ranking.

Hamilton registered his sixth shutout of the season last week for the Pioneers, who are ranked ninth overall in the NCAA Division II Soccer Poll. Oakland, 8-3-1 for the season, received 40 points in the poll, compared to No. 1 Lock Haven's 183 total.

The 5-foot-11, 165-pound Hamilton has given the Pioneers excellent goalkeeping in his first season of play after

transferring from Macomb Community College. Hamilton, a junior, has allowed only 16 goals and has made 99 saves in 12 games.

The OU booters will have a tough test this week against Spring Arbor College, an opponent the Pioneers defeated 1-0 last fall on a second-half goal by Danny Oskey. Oakland will play at Spring Arbor 2 p.m. Saturday behind the Hollie L. Lepley Sports Center on the OU campus.

The Pioneers are undefeated in four

games against Michigan teams. The OU booters have outscored its four Michigan opponents 17-1, beating Wayne State University, 9-1; the University of Michigan, 3-0; Eastern Michigan University, 2-0; and Western Michigan University, 3-0.

Freshman Morris Lupone is making the most of his scoring chances. The 6-foot-9, 170-pound forward is the Pioneers' leading scorer with 12 goals and five assists.

Last year, Oskey led the team in

scoring with four goals and five assists in 18 games.

WALT SMITH drew the spotlight at Woodland Lanes and for a good reason. He linked games of 237, 257 and 225 for 715. It was the first barrier-breaking series in the house this season.

ONE OF THE most hotly contested battles of the season was fought in the Bowlerettes league at Luxury Lanes Monday night when Marge Kropacek, the Canton housewife, pitted her Mr. F. team against Penny Behn's Bonanza squad. And trailing this trio was John Gustafson, with 256 in the Guys and Dolls loop.

AT GARDEN LANES Ed Kujawa, of the St. Louis league, was high with 685. In the Moose loop Dave Moran was top man with 669 and in the Youth league Joel Thompson, 16-year-old, scattered the pins for 671.

In the St. John Bosco league, it was Mark Lackey showing the way with 638 and in the ladies classic Barbara Gurlow lead the parade with 664.
