

# 'Y' Corrals Good Guys

FARMINGTON Good guys wear white hats. Watch for good guys wearing white hats around Farmington during the month of February.

These good guys are persons who have raised \$100 in new contributions toward the Farmington YMCA fund-raising drive now being held. The white hats are a reward designating them as persons who have done their part to insure Farmington has a strong YMCA.

For every amount over \$100, the good guys get YMCA stickers to put on their white hats.

A "WHITE HAT CORRAL" was held Wednesday morning in the Treasury House and

seven good guys received white hats.

They included Bill Conroy, drive chairman, Fred Chalfant, Jack Cotton, Bob Deady, Mrs. Ralph Chesley and Ed Balen, and Harley Warner.

Goal of the Y's 1970 drive is \$14,000. This is a 20% increase over last year's \$11,000 goal.

Funds raised in this month's drive are solely for operating expenses. The total YMCA budget for 1970 is \$65,423. Most Y programs are self-supporting, but Dave Confort, YMCA executive director, hopes to expand existing programs. Support is also needed so that persons who cannot pay can participate in the Y's programs.

Donations to the Y can be designated for any program a contributor desires, allowing contributors to relate to a specific program.

YMCA PROGRAMS and costs include:

- Membership - \$35
- Southeast Farmington Teen Center - cost \$50 per youth
- Camp scholarships - \$125 per youth
- Guys and Dolls, a summer recreational program for the mentally handicapped - cost \$65 per family
- High School exchange student - \$100 per youth
- Gray Y Club, an after school program for 4th, 5th and 6th graders - \$250 per club

Discussing the need for funds, drive chairman Conroy said: "If we are going to solve problems, and there are many problems to be solved, we need the Y and the tremendous job it does. To do this, we must become personally involved. Our goal is to get people personally involved in this fund-raising effort."

COMFORT SAID: "If the community responds to the goal of \$14,000, then the Farmington YMCA can continue to serve the youth of this community. Without community support we will have to eliminate some of our programs."

"Twenty per cent of our operating budget comes from the community. And we make this 20% go a long way. In 1969, we raised \$11,000 - this is only \$3,000 more.

Comfort continued, "We had 179 contributors in 1969. The difference in the amount needed this year has to come from new persons. We hope we can trust these friendships and support for 1970."

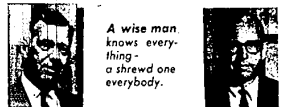
