

Brother Rice downs Borgess

St. Mary's to face grid test in Benedictine

Orchard Lake St. Mary's has not allowed a single point in the last half of each of its six games.

The Eagles kept up the streak against Detroit St. Andrews Sunday not allowing any second half points.

Neither did St. Mary's score in the second half, but it didn't matter. St. Mary's had a 27-0 lead going into the half.

"Realistically, we could've scored in the third and fourth quarters," said St. Mary's coach Al Dicken, "if we had left the same kids in."

Dicken went to his bench early in Sunday's game, giving some of his regular players a chance to rest.

Brett Green started the scoring for St. Mary's, running three yards for a touchdown early in the first quarter.

Green's touchdown was set up when the Eagles tackled the St. Andrew's punter on his own three following a bad snap.

Martin Vucinaj added the extra point. Vucinaj made three of four extra-point attempts.

GREEN SCORED his second touchdown — still in the first quarter — on a one-yard run. Vucinaj's kick gave the Eagles a 14-0 lead.

St. Mary's scored twice in the second quarter, both times on passes from junior quarterback Carl Pellegata. Pellegata hit Ryan Beckett with a 14-yard pass for the first touchdown, and Green with a 10-yard pass for the second.

St. Mary's totaled 174 yards on offense. The Eagles rushed for 120 yards, Green leading with 80. Pellegata was three for five for 54 yards.

St. Andrews was held to a negative 22 yards rushing and 35 yards passing for 13 total yards.

St. Mary's, now 5-1 overall, 4-0 in Division C of the Catholic League, hosts Detroit Benedictine at 2:30 p.m. Sunday.

There will be a number of things on the line Sunday. Both teams come into the game with 4-0 league records. Sunday's game will decide the league championship.

And both teams have streaks going. Benedictine will be looking for its 15th consecutive win, and St. Mary's will try to extend its streak to seven games in which it has not been scored on in the second half.

"We will find out this week how good that statistic really is," said Dicken. "We play a good team, an excellent team."

Benedictine has won the league championship two consecutive years. It shut out St. Mary's the last two years by 20-0 scores.

Rice finally got its ground game rolling Saturday against Bishop Borgess.

The Warriors have, of late, taken to the air on the arm of junior quarterback Dave Yarema.

But Rice rolled up 308 yards rushing Saturday and 84 yards passing for 402 total yards and a 49-0 win over Borgess.

There was no single dominant rusher for Rice despite the large yardage figure. Brad Cochran led the Warriors with 80 yards.

And he got all of those yards on a single touchdown jaunt to start the second half.

Rice moved out to a 21-0 lead in the first half. Yarema teamed up with Paul Jokisch on the opening drive with a 35-yard touchdown pass at 9:39 of the first quarter. Jim Ostrowski added the extra point.

Yarema kept it for himself on Rice's second touchdown, scoring from two yards out to cap a 12-play, 72-yard drive. Ostrowski kicked the extra point.

Ostrowski ended with seven points as he kicked extra points after each Rice touchdown.

YAREMA CLOSED out the first half scoring, hitting Greg Kaiser with a 14-yard touchdown pass with 24 seconds left in the second quarter. Greg Dingsen set up the touchdown by recovering a Borgess fumble on the 14.

Cochran chided down the sideline for his touchdown at 9:11 of the third quarter. Matt Chiodo also scored in the third quarter, going six yards after Jim Cherocci set up Rice on the Borgess 10 with a blocked punt.

Mike Borski scored at 9:05 of the fourth quarter, and Jim Caverly scored at 4:12.

Borgess did not get on the scoreboard until Rice had finished piling up points. Jim Ward scored late in the game on a nine-yard pass from Brendan McCarthy.

McCarthy hit Jim McDonald with a pass for the two-point conversion.

The Rice defense held Borgess to 181 total yards — 55 yards rushing and 126 yards passing.

The Warriors, now 6-0 overall, play at 2:30 p.m. Saturday at U-D High.

RU cagers topple Bentley

Redford Union, with a big surge during the third quarter, defeated Livonia Bentley 35-49 Tuesday in a non-league girls' basketball confrontation.

RU's victory avenged a 19-point loss to the Bulldogs earlier in the season.

"We had a very good third quarter," said Ken Dersey, coach of the Panthers. "Our girls scored well from the field. I would say we shot real well. We moved the ball well, looked for the open person and moved around well."

Bentley led 29-25 at the half, but RU held the upper hand 44-36 going into the final quarter.

Jillie Tacolla led RU with 18 points. She made eight-of-nine foul shots, six-of-seven during the fourth period.

Cathi Henry and Pam Smith each scored nine points for RU, while Lori Pastula added eight points and grabbed 17 rebounds.

"The girls played with a lot of enthusiasm and showed a lot of confidence," Dersey said.

Tina Ostach scored 15 points for Bentley, Kim Archer and Carla Campbell each added 10.

Bentley coach Tom Lang said he did not feel his team experienced a letdown after a thrilling one-point victory over Plymouth Salem in its last outing.

"We just didn't play well. We let them go to the free-throw line too many times," he said. "We had 21 field goals. Usually that's enough to win."

Bentley won the JV game 38-35.

LIVONIA STEVENSON played sluggishly during the first half, but held Wallied Lake Western scoreless during the third quarter en route to a 42-25 non-league win.

"We had a pretty poor first half, offensively," said Jim George, coach of the Spartans. "It just wouldn't go in."

"We came in off two intense wins (Inkster and Pontiac Northern). I was expecting a letdown and didn't know how to stop it," George added.

Karen Kelley and Wendy Jenkins scored 14 and 10 points, respectively, for Stevenson.

The Spartans won the JV game 52-31.

WESTLAND JOHN GLENN had no trouble disposing of Livonia Churchill 69-26 in a non-conference game. It was the second time this season that Glenn has defeated the Chargers.

"I think Churchill played well in the first half. We just overwhelmed them in the second half," said George Sommerman, coach of the Rockets.

"We were kind of slow in the first half and could have done better."

Glenn held quarter leads of 14-6, 30-12, 51-20 and 69-26.

Kim Ocsary and Gert Pizzuti each scored 14 points for the Rockets. Teri Chapo and Lynda Carlson each netted 10.

Julie Steadman led Churchill with 14.

Glenn won the JV preliminary 35-14.

REDFORD THURSTON out-pointed Farmington every quarter on the way to a 52-30 non-league win.

Wendy VandeSande tossed in 20 points, Laurie Mack 15 and Sandy Nissen nine for the victorious Eagles.

Farmington's Stacy Green, 6-3, scored 11 points and blocked eight shots. Lisa Borchanin, who has been scoring in double figures this season for the Falcons, did not play due to a knee injury.

Thurston forged a 13-6 lead during the first quarter and extended its advantage to 30-13 at the half.

The Eagles won the JV game 57-23.
