## Care givers meet producer

For the 16th consecutive year, care givers to children ages 3-6 will gather at Oakland University for a Preschool and Early Childhood Education Conference Nov. 8.

The conference will feature Hedda Bluestone Sharapan, associate producer of "Mister Rogers' Neighborhood," the award-winning television program for children.

On Nov. 7, Sharapan will conduct "You Are Special," an unusual intergenerational workshop to boost self-esteem. Those ages 8-80 may attend.

Sharapan's keynote address at the conference, "Is Television Chewing Gum For Their Eyes?" deals with what television means to children and how to make the medium better than gum chewing.

The conference theme is that people 3-6 are wonderful and "world opening" and that care givers can provide the optimal environment for youngsters and enjoy doing so.

The event is co-sponsored by the School of Human and Educational Services and the OU Conference Department.

It offers day care and nursery school personnel, social workers, medical support personnel, teachers and parents an opportunity to learn and share experiences with concerned others.

Conferees will have a choice of four breakout sessions in the morning: A) child care policies in Michigan — views of parents and providers, B) communicating with young children about death, C) human sexuality and

the preschool child, and D) who is hyperactive — myths and facts.

The 25 breakout sessions in the afternoon will be under five main topic headings: hands-on and curriculum, current issues, assessment, parenting and nutrition. A book exhibit-sale will be all day. An optional luncheon will be available.

A discount on the registration fee for the workshop and the conference, all day or half day, is available if registration and payment are made by Nov. 3. The conference fee is: all day, \$18; half day, \$9. Optional luncheon is \$5.40. Workshop fee is \$5.
