addition to Grace's network of U.S. facilities which are also located in Minneapolis, Chicago, Atlanta, Dallas, West Caldwell and Los Angeles.

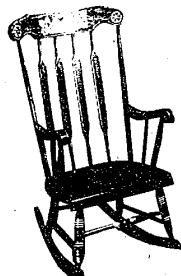
