She trades recipes with her sister and confides that at times she soft-boiled eggs while singing a psalm. One

day, as her husband packed to leave on another business trip, her singing tinged with sadness as he departed took longer than usual and she hard-boiled the eggs by mistake.

MRS. Harding became interested in

women in history after she and her youngest daughter learned to weave, make soap and dip candles.

After learning the tasks, she decided to learn about the women who did them daily and eventually had formulated a

vignette about an average 17th century housewife's day.

As with her monologue as Abigail Adams, Mrs. Harding didn't memorize her first vignette. Instead, she uses the props as prompts. As she looks at a prop she remembers a story and tells it to the audience.

"I don't ever want it to become a canned presentation," she said. Instead of becoming bored with her monologues, she's impressed with the women whom they reveal.

"Women were very strong. They were tremendously strong to do what they did," she said.

It was a time when men outlived women to the extent that it wasn't wholly unusual for a husband to see two wives buried.

"They're whole goal was staying alive," said Mrs. Harding.

"Today the goal is how to fill your leisure time," she said.

Although she deals with women from another era, she doesn't yearn to be transported back in time.

"I wouldn't want to live in a one-room cabin. Who wants to go back to that?"

Waiting for his chance in the 50-yard dash, Bill Firmant warmed up with stretching exercises. The 67-year-old Avon Township resident pulled muscles in both legs while winning a silver medal in the race, and had to withdraw from other running competition.

"It's disappointing," Firmant said. "I know how to prepare myself—I've done it before. I guess I wasn't ready."

Armand Auger, 68, of Troy, won the men's mile walk. Held outside the Silverdome, the route led walkers through the cold, rainy weather.

"It was kinda' chilly, but it was fun," Auger said. "They had spotters all the way around so you couldn't cheat and cut corners."

Eleanor Karasick was among the athletes who wished they'd trained harder for their events. The 64-year-old Southfield resident found herself faced with tough competition.

"Next year, I'm going to really train," Mrs. Karasick said after winning the gold medal in the pitch, hit and run contest. "Next year it'll not be one medal; it'll be three."

Among many Farmington area winners, Helen Karamon, 71, chuckled about her silver medal for Frisbee distance competition.

"That's the first time I had a Frisbee in my hand," she said.

Farmington Hills residents Sandy Darwin, 67, Carl Thornburg, 68, and Jewel Cooke, 72, each won three medals for swimming events. Betty

VanDorpe, 62, of Farmington, won three medals—two for swimming and one for golf.

Thomas Michaels, 73, of Avon Township, won a bronze medal in the men's 50-yard dash. But the Danish Village resident chose watching the Detroit Lions game over waiting to hear if he'd won a medal in the golf competition.

The awards and excitement were almost unending. The senior citizens were not the rocking chair-sitting, soap opera-watching stereotypes of the older generation.

"You wouldn't believe how good it makes you feel to stand up there and win a medal," Mrs. Finkowski said.

To make it even more disconcerting for municipalities, the state isn't required to make up that inflation loss, according to Deadman.

Although Farmington could rely on increasing its millage rate in the future, Deadman doubts whether a future council would raise taxes in the face of Tisch approval.

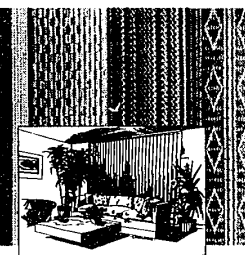
Presently, Farmington levies 10.6 mills. The maximum allowable limit is 20.

Farmington Hills doesn't even have that luxury. Its charter caps millage at ten.

"The unfairness of Tisch is that I'm not sure that people are sure of what will happen," says Deadman.

"In fact, Tisch will cripple cities. That entity of government closest to the people will be crippled the most," he says.
