Editor:

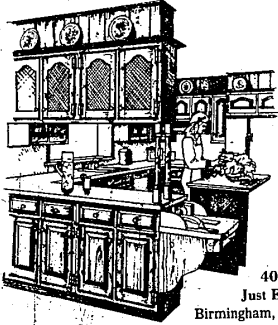
Any politician in Michigan who actually works against the Tisch amendment should be fired and lose all pension rights.
