She says that the workshop should allay any preconceived notions that only

the most-experienced sewer should tackle this luxury fabric.

"My students lose all apprehensions they might have had and go on to achieve great results," she says. "It is a class for the beginning as well as the experienced sewer."

She says that sewing with ultra-suede utilizes a leather technique and method of sewing plus the use of new necessary tools. No glue is used.

Mrs. Vantrese brings more than 25 years of sewing, tailoring, quilting and knitting experience to her classes and has taught all levels throughout the metro area.

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
