Young artists called to vie in Oakway's 1981 competition

Applications are available now for pianists and vocalists who wish to enter Oakway Symphony Young Artist Competition. A total of \$3,000, made possible by grants, will be given to the first, second, third and fourth prize winners.

The competition will be held in February, 1981, in Madonna College, Livonia, and the winners will appear as soloists with the symphony in concert, in April.

Contestants must be a resident or student in Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland, St. Clair, Washtenaw or Wayne counties.

Piano contestants must be under 25 years of age to qualify and voice contestants under 30 years at the time of the awards presentation in April.

Contestants must select a composition associated with a symphonic program, not to exceed 15 minutes, and

they must supply their own accompanists.

THIS IS THE third year the symphony is sponsoring its competition for musicians interested in solo performance.

Previous competitions have been limited to residents and students of Oakland and Wayne counties, but has been expanded to include five other counties at the request of Michigan Council for the Arts.

The contest has already been arranged for the 1981-82 season, when orchestral instrumentalists will compete.

Last season, the first prize went to violinist Sara Parkins of Birmingham.

Other area winners were Viola player Scott Woolweaver from Garden City, flutist Cindy Koleda and French horn player David Everson, both from Livonia.

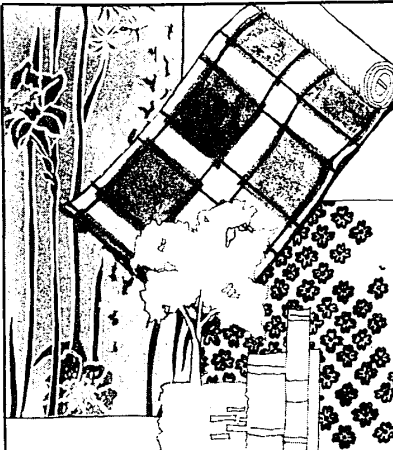
