How many inches of insulation should I use to make my house energy proof?

The amount of insulation needed to make your tone more energy efficient should be measured in R-numbers not in inches. The R stands for resistanc to winter heat loss and summer heat gain and is more accurate as a means of designating insulation performance. R-values should be plainly marked on all insulation you or your contractor bought. One brand may be thinner or thicker than another, but if they are rated at the same R-value, the performance will be the same.
