

Church will host Weddige exhibit

First Methodist Church of Birmingham is hosting a private exhibition of original lithographs by Michigan artist-lithographer, Emil Weddige 1-5 p.m. Sunday, Nov. 2.

The congregation will have an opportunity to attend the show following the 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. services.

The artist and Mrs. Weddige will be present for the exhibition which includes more than 40 award winning original color lithographs and marks his 51st year of touring one-man shows throughout the world.

This year Weddige's "Lucky" was selected by the University of Maine Museum of Art for its collection of the 70 best color lithographs produced in 500 years of printmaking. This lithograph is included in the Birmingham exhibition.

ALSO FEATURED in this exhibit will be The Children's Suite, a series of three original lithographs created for the Methodist Children's Home Society. Proceeds from the sale of all prints will go to support Methodist Children's Home Society's Children's Village.

Methodist Children's Home Society, founded in 1917 and located on 65 acres in northwest Detroit, is a private, non-profit, fully accredited child welfare agency serving Michigan children and their families regardless of race, creed, color or gender.

Weddige was born in 1927 of American parents in Sandwich, Ontario. He completed his undergraduate work in Michigan and continued his education in art in New York and Paris. In 1957 he completed his master's degree in design at University of Michigan and ex-

hibited his oils, watercolors and lithographs throughout the United States.

HOWEVER, BY 1949, color lithography commanded all of his attention. His "Le Colosseum" was selected by the Binet Collection in New York as one of the best 23 prints in America. His "Salerno and the Saints" has been judged one of the finest religious prints of the century.

Mrs. Alfred H. Taylor, Jr. heads the committee and Mrs. Robert Stoner is making the exhibition arrangements.

NOW pushes for Reagan defeat

The National Organization for Women (NOW) has taken a stand against Ronald Reagan and will picket any public appearances of Reagan or vice presidential nominee George Bush.

According to Janet Evans, president of NOW's Northwest Wayne County Chapter, delegates to a NOW national conference resolved to picket Reagan and Bush, "everywhere they appear in order to bring to the attention of the public the Republican party's stands against the Equal Rights Amendment

(ERA) and reproductive freedom for women."

She said the delegates attending the 1980 National Issues Conference in San Antonio, Texas, passed a four-point resolution calling for Reagan's defeat.

Ms. Evans said the San Antonio Light, which reported on the conference, had this to say: "Passage of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) burned like a fever in the consciousness of the 1,500 delegates who attended."

Other conference resolutions en-

dorsed the Democratic party platform and withdrew a previous resolution

(passed in December 1979) which urged active opposition to Carter's re-election.

Another resolution amended the organization's by-laws to permit the election of the term of office of the national NOW president, Eleanor Smeal, and the current board of directors

through June 30, 1982.

The date is the last date that the ERA amendment can be ratified as a constitutional amendment by the necessary number of states. Unless the legislatures of 38 states approve the amendment by June, 1982 the Equal Rights Amendment will not be approved as a constitutional amendment. Presently 35 states have approved.

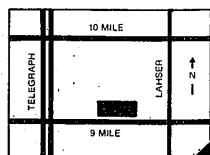
