

Travel series opens with Portugal

The Community House in Birmingham will begin its 1980-81 Travel Film Series at 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday.

Opening the new series will be photographers Lisa Chickering and Jeanne Porterfield, narrating their color film "Bravo Portugal!" Tickets are available in advance at The Community House, Bates and Townshead.

"Bravo Portugal!" was noted by James Edward (director at New York Town Hall) as being "the best film presented in the 34 years of the travel film series in Town Hall."

Armchair travelers will first journey to the capital city of Lisbon, where they will join in the gaiety of the celebration of Heroes' Day. Townspeople from miles around gather to join in the dancing and singing at this celebration.

LATER, ST. ANTHONY'S Eve begins and results in 61 couples coming together to declare vows of marriage. All are dressed in the traditional and unusual black wedding attire.

Travelling south to the unique fishing village of Nazare, viewers will pass by the sun-drenched shores of Lisbon's spectacular coastline, viewing the royal palaces of Queluz, Sintra and Pena.

Once reaching the village of Nazare, viewers will share a day with a fisherman and his family as they go about their individual and collective activities.

Armchair travelers also will view the activities of the Tuna Fishermen of the Algarve, where film footage of a 600-pound tuna is included. Along the coastal areas of Portugal, colorfully decorated gondola-type boats are commonplace, with many seen carrying their cargoes of seaweed.

ics fashioned after the styles of the ancient Romans and worn today as work clothes.

TOURING DOWN the steeply terraced vineyards of the Douro Valley provides some of Portugal's most magnificent scenery, as well as being the location of some of the finest port wines. The town of Porto, oldest and second most important city in Portugal, displays its main attraction, Porto's unparalleled Wine Institute.

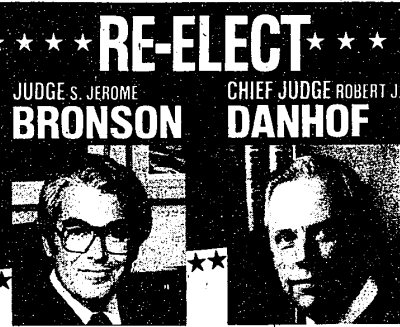
Here viewers will have a chance to see how this fine wine is made, as well as learn the history behind it.

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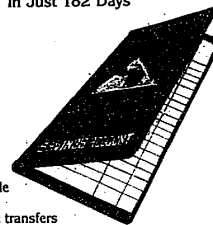
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
