Ms. Williams, PAAC's prevention and education coordinator, is training professional staff volunteers to teach the course so that demand can be met. This is the fifth year of PEP, which is funded by a state grant.

It began as an idea for dealing with prevention of drug abuse, but it's grown more encompassing.
"In the 1980s, a scare tactics approach was used regarding drug experimentation," Ms. Williams said. "Kids were told if they smoked marijanna, they were going to die. That didn't work because it wann't true, obviously."

"THE NEXT TAC was to inform them of the dangers of drug use on the pretense that education would curb abuse. That only gave us well informed

abuse. That only gave us well informed trug users.

"The third effort was to look at why people abuse drugs. Reasons ranged from a lack of personal skills, not knowing how to make decisions to not knowing how to say no to friends."

It was the third preventive effort under which PEP was created.

"At first, the class was made up of referrals from the Farmington Hills' Police juvenile division," Ms. Williams said. "These were good kids, not juve-

alle delinquents, but kids caught out after currier or caught loitering."

Other referrals came from churches and scholer of the control of t

ganizations can make a group contribu-tion.

"Adolescents would benefit most from the course," Ms. Williams said.
"Parents would also benefit, as would anyone in-between looking for skills."


