Unless you own a new car, Michigan license plates for 1982 may cost you at least \$10 more. The reason: a federally-mandated car pollution inspection program. If your car's exhaust exceeds emission guildelines, the new law may mean another \$30 repair bill before the Michigan Secretary of State's office will re-register your car.

THE ADDITIONAL fees are part of a Vehicle inspection and Maintenance Program (I/M) approved by the Michigan Legislature in April. when a vehicle has met the program guidelines. Vehicle exhaust will be tested for re-lease of hydrocarbons and carbon monoxide.

ALL VEHICLES will be required to get a certificate showing compliance with the new program except those made before 1972 and those with either diesel or electric powered engines. Motorcycles and mopeds are also exempt from the program.

Also exempt are those who have bought a new car 12 months prior to renewing registration and low-income car owners. The low-income exemption follows the same guidelines as the federal Medicaid program.

The inspection fee will be "no more than \$10," said Rodger James, director of the state Dealer Licensing Division. If a car needs a tune-up or other repairs to meet emission guidelines, those repairs are not to exceed \$50, James said.
