

Museum displays office furniture

Designer Niels Diffrient's line of office seating, developed for Knoll International, will be featured in an exhibition at Cranbrook Academy of Art Museum Nov. 11 through Dec. 7 and in a slide lecture by Diffrient Nov. 20.

Originally from the Detroit area, Diffrient graduated from Cass Technical High School and earned a degree in design and architecture at Cranbrook Academy of Art. He then worked for five years with Eero Saarinen in Bloomfield Hills where he helped Saarinen design an early chair series for Knoll.

For 25 years Diffrient has worked with Henry Dreyfuss Associates, New York, whose major clients include Po-

laroid, Bell Telephone, John Deere and American Airlines.

Diffrient co-authored the design publication, "Humanscale," which includes extensive data on stress-free seating for aircraft and heavy equipment. This information, compiled during 30 years of research by Diffrient and his Dreyfuss colleagues, was used in the new line of competitively-priced office seating.

The exhibition comprises 12 Knoll/Diffrient office chairs, designed to evenly distribute body weight and reduce skeletal tension.

Also on view is the Cranbrook Collection which includes chairs designed by Cranbrook artists Eliel and Eero Saarinen, Charles Eames and Harry Bertola.

Knoll International, recognized as an innovative leader in the design of furniture and interiors, was developed by Florence Knoll, who studied at Kingswood School Cranbrook and Cranbrook Academy of Art, and her husband, Hans.

During his Nov. 20 lecture, Diffrient will discuss a variety of work by Henry Dreyfuss. The 8 p.m. presentation will be held in the academy of art lecture hall. Admission, \$2, includes the lecture and exhibition.
