

Seaholm '5' downs Jays

Southfield outscored Birmingham Seaholm 22-17 in the second half of their game Thursday.

But Seaholm outscored Southfield 27-17 in the first half.

And Seaholm beat the Jays, 44-39.

"What it amounted to," said Southfield coach Walt Duda, "in the first half we couldn't find the bucket, and everything they threw up went in."

You could say that Southfield lost it in the first quarter when Seaholm outscored the Jays 18-3. They actually played the Maples known until the fourth quarter when the Blue Jays outscored Seaholm 10-5.

You could also say the Jays lost it at the foul line. Seaholm and Southfield both made 17 field goals, but Seaholm outscored Southfield 10-5 at the line.

But Southfield most likely lost it in the backcourt. The Seaholm backcourt pair of Pam Brooks and Julie Fremuth hit for 17 points each, scoring 34 of the Maples' 44 points.

"Pam Brooks really did a job on us," said Duda. "She played excellent basketball. Julie Fremuth was kind of like the silent one, the one they feed off of, the one you don't know is scoring until all of a sudden she's killing you."

"Julie," said Seaholm coach Jeff Parry, "on defense we put her on Toni Watkins. We didn't play exactly a box and one, but sort of. Julie did a fantastic job on her."

"Pam," he continued, "had a super game inside and outside."

The loss dropped Southfield to 7-7 overall, 6-5 in the Southeastern Michigan Association. The Jays are on the road tomorrow at Troy.

Seaholm is 9-7 overall, 8-3 in the SMA. The Maples host Andover on Tuesday.

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Sterling Heights Stevenson is victim

Rice rolls in Class A playoff

Birmingham Brother Rice coach Al Fracassa knew he had a fight on his hands.

And if it wasn't for two clutch defensive plays late in the fourth quarter, his football team might be ousted from the state playoffs.

Brother Rice (10-0) escaped with a 25-13 victory over a tough Sterling Heights Stevenson squad to earn a return trip to Birmingham Groves next Saturday.

The Warriors will battle Detroit Central in a 1:30 p.m. semifinal contest.

Rice outplayed the Macomb Athletic Conference champions before an overflow crowd of 6,000 at Falcon Field on Saturday. But uncharacteristic Warrior mistakes and a determined Stevenson effort kept the outcome in doubt until late in the final stanza.

"We're not a perfect team," Fracassa said of his Catholic League champions. "I told you Stevenson was good. Why did you go 9-0? That's why they were here."

STEVENSON TOOK advantage of four Rice fumbles and numerous penalties to stay within striking range. In fact, the Titans trailed 19-13 and had the ball inside the Warrior five-yard line with 7:29 left in the game but couldn't pull ahead.

"They played hard — they're a good team," Fracassa said of Stevenson. "That's the way it is when you get in the playoffs. Everybody wants Brother Rice and that's it."

"I'm glad we won, but it was a hard battle."

The Titans pulled within six points, 19-13, early in the fourth quarter on a 17-yard touchdown run by Scott Prechtel. On the ensuing kickoff, Rice's Mike Stott fumbled and Stevenson had the ball back at the Warrior 35-yard line with a chance to go ahead.

Six plays later the Titans had a fourth down play inside the five-yard line, but Rice middle guard Fred Konkel sacked Titan quarterback Steve Coulter to stifle the rally.

BRAD COCHRAN, an All-State candidate, stopped the Titans' final drive by intercepting a

Coulter pass deep in Stevenson territory with 4:29 left on the clock.

After that interception, junior quarterback Dave Yarema ran four yards on the second play of the drive for the final six points of the game. It was Yarema's second touchdown run of the game.

Yarema's arm gave Rice a 19-6 advantage early in the second half. He threw for the other two touchdowns and finished the day hitting 13 of 17 passes for 283 yards.

Senior tight-end Steve Allen caught Yarema's first five completions and scored the game's first touchdown — 54-yard catch midway in the first quarter.

Paul Jokisch, a 6-foot-7 receiver, caught four passes for 142 yards. One Jokisch catch went 44 yards to set up Rice's second touchdown, a 17-yard run by Yarema to give Rice a 13-0 advantage with 6:22 left in the first half.

Cochran caught three passes. His final catch was an eight-yard TD grab which gave Rice a 19-6 lead.

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
