Job security doesn't worry incum-bent Oakland County commissioners. Of 27 members of the board of com-missioners, all 19 incumbents who ran missioners, all 19 incumbents who ran for re-election were returned by an av-erage 2-1 margin. One incumbent ran unopposed, and seven others either ran for other offices or did not seek re-elec-

for other offices or did not seek re-elec-tion.

In contrast, Pontiac Democrat Hu-bert Price Jr. won a new two-year term with 55 percent, the highest mar-gin in any Oakland commissioner dis-trict.

AN 18-9 REPUBLICAN majority will dominate the new county board in January. The GOP, which controls all committee assignments and other county board appointments, increased its 16-11 voting edge by winning two seats in Royal Oak and Berkley/Huntington Woods previously held by Democrats.
