Ammerman averaged 75.8 for the season, was match medalist seven times and runner-up five times. His dual-meet average was 75.0.

In Southeastern Michigan Association (SMA) competition, Ammerman was league runner-up. He was also second at the Tri-State Invitational (Kent, Ohio), which included some of the best golfers from Michigan, Ohio and Pennsylvania.

Andover finished with an 8-2 overall record, 4-2 in the SMA. Andover won four of the six tournaments it entered, and was second in another.

PAT CHISHOLM — BROTHER RICE

Chisholm averaged 38.3 (nine holes) for the Warriors.

Chisholm was match medalist in eight of the 12 matches in which he was entered.

In tournament action, he was third at the Catholic League finals among 54 participants with a round of 78. He carded the same score at the Oakland County championships among 172 golfers and finished fourth.

At the Bedford Invitational, Chisholm shot an 89 that placed him fourth among 140 golfers. Chisholm shot a regional score of 81 and placed 10th overall.

RAY HAJJAR — CRANBROOK

Hajjar was a pressure performer.

At the three meets that really counted — state, regional and league — Hajjar finished first, second and second.

Hajjar, who averaged 39.1, won the Class B individual title with a score of 77. He shot a 79 at the regional and finished second, and a 77 at the Metro Suburban Golf League finals in third second.

At the Oakland County Tournament, Hajjar placed 12th with a round of 80.

Hajjar was match medalist nine times, and had one subpar round of 35 at Wakeek — the Cranes' home course.

Hajjar is the current Michigan Junior Amateur champion. He also made the quarterfinal round at the U. S. Jun-

ior Amateur Tournament.

MATT JACKSON WEST BLOOMFIELD

West Bloomfield coach Art Link called Jackson "one of the best golfers in the school's history." And he's only a

sophomore.

Jackson's dual-meet average was 38.8, and he was match medalist seven times this fall. Jackson finished second at the Greater Oakland Activities League (GOAL) meet (at Edgewood) with an 82.

In tournament action, Jackson won the two-man scramble Detroit Country Day Invitational; placed fourth at the Novi Invitational; placed fourth at the Plymouth Best Ball Tournament (25 two-man teams).

Jackson finished second among 88 participants at the regional meet (Springfield Oaks) with a 76. He tied for 12th place at the Oakland County meet.

Jackson's best dual-meet score was 37 against Detroit Country Day at Oakland Hills and against Waterford Kettering at Tam-O-Shanter. On three different occasions he carded rounds of 38.

"He's very competitive, and he was the number one man for West Bloomfield," said Link.

JOSH MONDRY — GROVES

You need a resume to list all of Mondry's accomplishments.

Monday was runner-up at the regional tournament with a 76, and successfully defended his Metro Suburban Activities Association (MSAA) title with a 78. Monday was third at the Tri-State Invitational (Kent, Ohio) with rounds of 83 and 75.

Monday, one of the state's premiere young golfers, was third at the Oakland County championships with a 78.

Besides his high school credentials, Monday is also one of the state's top amateur golfers.

Monday, Groves' 1979 Most Valuable Player, qualified this past summer for the Michigan U.S. Open where he finished fourth out of 103 pros and amateurs combined.

He won the state G.A.M. Junior (under 18 years) championship, and was a runner-up at the Michigan Junior Amateur championship. He was also second at the Washtenaw Junior Invitational.

WADE STEVENSON — ADAMS

Wade Stevenson had a unique golf career at Rochester Adams.

"He had the unusual experience of playing on a state championship team as a sophomore three years ago," said Adams coach Carl Pajsbjerg.

CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A Regular Meeting of the Farmington City Council was held November 3, 1980 in the Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty St., Farmington, Michigan. The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor William S. Hartsock.

PRESENT: Mayor Hartsock, Councilmen Bennett, Buckler, Tupper and Yoder.
ABSENT: None.

CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Billing, Director Seifer, Attorney Kelly, City Clerk Viane.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as corrected.

Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.

Council approved sponsoring a girl to the American Legion Auxiliary Girls State at a cost of \$130.00. Mayor Hartsock was appointed to receive the applicant's report.

Resolution from the City of Oak Park supporting an amendment to Act 279-1909, was received and filed.

Council was opposed to HB 5542 and in favor of legislation which would enact a Federal Drug Paraphernalia Act.

Proclamation was issued designating November 23-30 as "BIBLE WEEK."

Resolution adopted establishing a Public Hearing to review the 1980 Sidewalk Program Assessment Roll on November 17, 1980 at 8:00 p.m. and also on December 1, 1980 at 8:00 p.m.

Council established a Public Hearing to receive comments regarding the Community Block Grant Program on November 17, 1980 at 8:00 p.m.

Councilman Deadman submitted a Feasibility Study for the acquisition of the Governor Warner Mansion. Mr. William Stocum and his sister, Mrs. Sue Klingbeil, were present to discuss their proposed gift of the property.

Payment in the amount of \$34,253.80 was authorized to the Triangle Excavating Company for work completed on Division F of the Water System Improvement Program.

City Manager Deadman reported on the progress of the Orchard Lake Road widening.

The Financial Report Water and Sewer Fund was received and filed.

The Department of Public Services Quarterly Report was received and filed.

The monthly bills were approved for payment.

The following ordinance was adopted:

ORDINANCE NO. C-470-80

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 9.132 (a) AND (b) OF CHAPTER 89 OF TITLE IX OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

9.132. Release of Dogs. No dog shall be released from the pound, unless the owner or his authorized agent shall pay to the Department of Public Safety a fee as set forth in the following schedule:

(a) For release of a licensed dog, properly immunized against rabies, ten dollars (\$10.00).

(b) Payment of the cost of boarding said dog, at the rate of six dollars (\$6.00) for each day said dog has been in said pound, with a minimum charge, however, for one day.

This ordinance was introduced at a regular meeting of the Farmington City Council on October 20, 1980, was adopted and enacted at the next regular meeting on November 3, 1980 and will become effective ten days after publication.
