This year also marks the 100th anniversary of the admission of the Felician Sisters into the Archdiocese of Detoil. In 1869 Bishop Caspar Borgess gave Mother Mary Monica Syblista permission to transfer the Felician notherhouse to the Detroit Diocese. They started serving here two years earlier.

FELICIAN ROOTS reach back to Warsaw, Poland, where in 1855 a young women, Sophia Truszkowska, and her sister Clothilde Ciechanowska, reached out to help the poor, abandoned chil-dren of the street. Soon other compan-ions joined them in the charitable ac-tivities, first as lay members of the St.

Vincent DePaul Society and later as secular Franciscans.

They rented a two-room attic apartment for the children and some homeless aged women. The people seeing these pious women praying at the statue of St. Felix began calling them Feli-ian Sisters. The women accepted this name and placed their institute under the protection of St. Felix. Later they received permission to live together as a religious sisterhood.

Within five years of their founding they were conducting an orphanage and a residence for aged women. They established a 40-bed hospital, a school for girls and classes of religious instruction.
During the 1865 insurrection against Russia, the Felicians Sisters' hospitals were used as provisional hospitals by

and poor needing care increased at this time. But the uprising failed and the Felicians were ordered by the Russians

to disband.

The Emperor of Austria came to their rescue, giving them permission to establish a motherhouse in the Austrian-occupied sector of Poland. A new province of Cracow was formed, Again a school, orphanage and center for a school, orphanage and center for youths and adults were founded. Even-tually they established two other prov-inces in Lvov in 1910 and Warsaw in

Today about 1,000 sisters minister to Today about 1,000 sisters minister to others through home health care, social work and evangelization. However, the Communist-dominated government confiscated their educational institu-tions.

TO MEET LOCAL educational needs, the sisters founded Ladywood High School for girls in 1850. A summer camp for girls was opened the same year in Bolly Mich.

In the late 1950s officials and citizens of Livouia Plymouth, Redford Township, Farmington and Northville approached Mother Mary Annuncia Kramp asking that a hospital be established on the Livouia property. In 1950 St. Mary Hospital opened its doors.

In addition to its treatment pro-grams, it offered a variety of other ser-vices.
