Ms. Stav studied with Mischa Kottler and graduated from the University of Michigan school of music where she studied with Elizabeth Zajac and Eugene Bossart. She is currently completing her masters at Oakland University where she studies with Flavio Varani.

She has performed at University of Michigan and Oakland University and this year was presented by Birmingham Musicale and The Young Keyboard Artists of Grand Rapids. Last month she was selected to perform at the master class at Oakland University conducted by Magda Tagliaferro.

In addition to teaching piano in Southfield, Ms. Stav is a member of National Guild of Piano Teachers, Detroit Musicians League and Birmingham Musicale. She will perform works by Mozart and Chopin at the Nov. 18 meeting.

Ms. Rosner-Doecker received the Traub scholarship when she was a sen-

ior in the Bloomfield Hills school district, the Birmingham Musicale Amy Lyle award, the Ma Phi Epsilon scholarship and the Mary Segula award. At Michigan State University she was flutist for the opera orchestra, the chamber orchestra and the concert band. She studied privately with Russell Friedewald.

In Detroit she has studied with Detroit Symphony Orchestra members, Shaul Ben-Meir, Clement Barone, Robert Patrick and Ervin Moore. Her professional affiliations include the Detroit and national flute associations, Mu Phi Epsilon Alumnae, Birmingham Musicale, Farmington Musicale and Little Musicale. She is a flute teacher and active performer in the metropolitan area.

At the Nov. 18 performance, she will be accompanied by her mother, Collette Salvo Rosner in works by Copland and Doppler.

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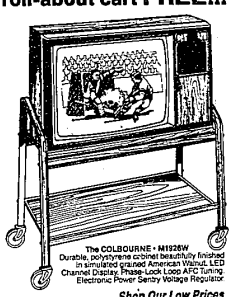
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
